Prudent Pet has several plan choices with set annual limits, such as its ultimate plan, which provides infinite annual coverage. If your pet requires complex treatment in the event of an accident or illness, an unrestricted plan eliminates the worry of running out of money. It also offers wellness plans covering routine care costs like vet visit expenses and vaccinations.

Prudent Pet insurance does not cover <u>pre-existing conditions</u>, organ transplants, cosmetic operations, alternative therapies, or prescription food. Prudent Pet's coverage entirely covers accidents and illnesses. Prudent currently covers only dogs and cats.

The cost of pet insurance is determined by several factors, such as the breed and age of your dog or cat. The typical annual cost is \$39, whereas a cat's yearly expenditure is about \$23. A monthly premium for a cat will set you back around \$13.95 per month; that price increases to around \$19.95 for a dog. Prudent Pet claims to have faster claim processing thanks to its usage of AI technology.

## **Embrace**

The Embrace pet insurance program is competitive, yet it also offers unique benefits. Embrace has protected over 100,000 pets over the 19 years they have been around. They also have a match program to add \$2 to a pet-related charity for each policy acquired. Since 2012, Embrace has worked with American Modern Insurance Group to underwrite its policies.

- 5 percent Armed Forces discount
- ACH discounts
- Spay/neuter savings
- Monthly payment discounts if you pay yearly rather than every month
- Embrace also has a wellness rewards program called Embrace Wellness Rewards.
- Their preventative care policy reimburses basic veterinary training and grooming costs regularly.
- Embrace also offers a Healthy Pet Deductible, which allows you to deduct \$50 from your pet's yearly premium if you don't file a claim.
- Embrace covers a fair amount of illness and issues. Here are some of what is covered:
  - Diagnostic Tests
  - Specialty Care
  - Cancer Treatments
  - Hospitalization
  - Behavioral Therapy
  - o Follow-up Care
  - Rehabilitation

- Prosthetic Limbs
- Dental Illness up to \$1,000/year
- Prescription Medications

- Chronic conditions

Embrace's exclusions are better than those of other insurance companies. Embrace does not cover pregnancy, pre-existing conditions, intentional injuries, cosmetic operations, DNA testing, or stem cell treatment. Embrace currently covers only cats and dogs.

The cost of dog insurance varies from \$30 to \$40 per month, while cat insurance costs between \$15 and \$20 monthly. Rates will differ based on the pet's age, gender, and breed.

## **ASPCA**

ASPCA pet insurance is a member of the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, contributing to its high standing as a pet insurance provider. It also backs up its coverage and provides a 30-day money-back promise, which is appreciated. In addition, similar to other pet health insurance providers, ASPCA does not require preliminary tests before enrolling.

- ASPCA has a user-friendly mobile app that allows pet insurance members to file claims, contact customer care, check their benefits, and pay their premiums using their phones.

- ASPCA presently offers coverage only for cats and dogs.

Like other pet insurance providers, the ASPCA does not cover pre-existing conditions, plastic surgery, or breeding expenses. It also offers less coverage for dental issues than others.

Although the SPCA is a fantastic organization, it charges more than other pet insurance options. For dogs, the average cost of ASPCA dog and cat insurance is \$49 per month, while for cats, it's \$29. Please keep in mind that these costs will vary based on your pet's age and condition, as well as where you live and other circumstances.

## **Healthy Paws**

Healthy Paws Pet Insurance & Foundation was established in 2009 as a non-profit organization focused on assisting pet owners with financial obligations for their pets while also aiding animal rescue organizations with sick animals. They operate grant programs that have dispersed over 1.6 million dollars to shelters and rescues.

Healthy Paws insurance has partnered with Aon Corporation, a global insurance broker, and Chubb Group backs its pet insurance plans.

- Healthy Paws does charge a one-time new customer fee of \$25.
- The typical cost for dogs is \$39 per month and for cats is \$12 per month.

Spot Pet Insurance is a no-obligation policy to safeguard your pet from high-cost and inconvenient veterinary visits. There's nothing complicated about it. You simply wait after receiving care at the vet, submitting a claim, and waiting for reimbursement. You may adjust the coverage amount to fit your pet's needs and financial restrictions, as well as customize the policy to match your preferences. Crum & Forster Pet Insurance is the insurance provider for Spot.

# How Does Pet Insurance Work in Maryland?

A quote from the ASPCA: "Pet insurance can help provide coverage for medical costs that traditional health insurance doesn't cover as well as those expenses you're simply unprepared to pay. When it comes to your pet, there's no predicting when an accident or illness might happen."

In general, a plan is set up between the owner and the insurer. The details of this agreement—the rules of coverage, exclusions, limitations on dollar amounts for specific procedures--are spelled out in the policy.

Once the premium is paid and everything is in place, most significant diseases and injuries are covered regardless of age or breed. However, there may be times when veterinary care wasn't fully compensated for whatever reason, even due to personal reasons such as not having updated the policy. In these instances, the pet owner would have to pay the vet bill and submit a claim to the insurance company for reimbursement.

Many pet insurance companies operate in Maryland, so it's essential to do your research before deciding which is best for you and your furry friend. Remember, preventive care is key to maintaining your pet's health, so make sure you're up-to-date on all vaccinations and screenings!

# How to Choose the Best Pet Insurance in Maryland for You

The most important factors you should consider when buying pet insurance are:

- Your budget

- Reimbursement: How much of the cost of a procedure or medication will be reimbursed to you. This also varies depending on the carrier and your plan.
- Preventative Care: Some plans offer free or discounted preventive care, such as routine exams, vaccinations, and spaying/neutering. Others do not cover these services at all.

It's essential to choose an insurer that maintains relationships with most veterinary hospitals in Maryland. It becomes much more challenging to coordinate care when something happens if they don't. For example, what if you're in the middle of treatment at one hospital but need surgery at another? Making sure they are all covered under one company makes it easier for follow-up treatments.

  must pick it up and remove it. You may be fined \$100 if you do not comply.
- All dogs and cats must have a license and be vaccinated if at least four months old.
- The state has its criteria for tethering a dog.
- The county requires that all dogs and cats older than a year be registered.
- If your dog or cat is not on your property, the Animal at Large law states that it must be leashed or confined.
- The Unwanted Contact legislation stipulates that dog owners keep their dogs away from locations where their presence might cause alarm or injury to another person.
