In the local area, you have the Stillwater School District (public); St. Croix Catholic (private); Salem Lutheran (private); St. Croix Preparatory Academy (charter), New Heights School (charter), and recently River Grove (charter) in Marine.

Each of the schools in the area serves a different niche—with New Heights currently serving your family—or at least part of it. This




