Whether it's pioneering a new arts renaissance or creating the world's first center for the study of tea, these projects will reimagine the way our world works.

Arts Renaissance: We are revamping our top-ranked arts programs with endowed faculty, graduate fellowships and new facilities. In addition, The California Studio: Manetti Shrem Artist Residencies will bring prominent artists to campus to engage in teaching and artistic scholarship. Support for all these efforts will bring our "Renaissance" to life.

Design Futures: As the only comprehensive design department within the UC system, we are reimagining our nationally renowned design program to focus on improving the quality of life for all and leading a national conversation about the impact of design. Funding goals include an endowed faculty chair, professorships and endowed lectures; student fellowships; and research funds.

- Offers flexibility by allowing you to provide for family first.


