



At first, I was going to focus on East Asian studies.^{*} In fact, I spent my first two years as an East Asian studies/ Japanese double major. But I found a whole world of possibilities in the Middle East & North Africa Studies program when I met my curriculum advisor and my honors program mentor. They became my biggest advocates, inviting me to conferences and encouraging me to not sell myself short. Because of them, I decided to study humanitarian aid for refugees in the Middle East and was even able to conduct independent research on Syrian refugees. Shortly after graduation, I became marketing director of Urban Refuge, an app project aimed at connecting refugees to resources in Amman, Jordan."
