

## 20 Powerful Books on the Writing Craft

A Goodreads search reveals that there are more than 12,374 published books about the writing process. From learning about the seven basic plots or making sense of character archetypes to overcoming writers' block or writing "down the bones," how do you select the books that will most help your writing career?

Studying the best authors in whatever genre you write, the award-winners; the ones who remain in print after 20, 50, even 100 years; or simply those authors whose books resonate with you long after reading the last page, will inevitably shape WHAT you write. Likewise, look to those same authors when choosing books about HOW to write.
