"Free Ride Day on The JO is our way to say thank you to our regular riders and hopefully attract some new ones who've thought about riding the bus but never tried it before," says Cris Lowe, Community Relations Coordinator for Johnson County Transit. "Riders can take The JO Xpress to downtown Kansas City or hop on the K-10 Connector to spend the day in Lawrence, for example, for free, and can even enjoy free Wi-Fi on the ride."
