






## A Legacy of Learning

### Why Letter People?

Foundational literacy sets the stage for every skill children will learn in their academic careers. But not all children enter Pre-K with the developmental abilities necessary to learn abstract literacy concepts, like the sounds and symbols for all 26 letters. So what can you, as an educator, do?

DIG Literacy's daily whole group literacy circle features hands-on activities designed to begin building foundational literacy skills:


- Phonological awareness

### **Ongoing Spiraling Instruction**

During **center time** each day, teachers can meet with **as many or few groups as needed**. Each small group time can last from 5 minutes to 20 minutes, **based on student's needs**.

DIG Literacy's components support children with a variety of engaging and developmentally appropriate tools for building foundational literacy skills.


#### 8 Teacher's Guides
