M.Dev.Dev. is the final tenant to move into historic Doelger Building  
After a three-year remodel, the Inner Sunset building is at capacity

**San Francisco, Feb. 26, 2016:** Medical Device Development, a medical device engineering firm, is the final tenant to move into the historic Doelger Building in San Francisco's Inner Sunset neighborhood. The building, located at 320 Judah Street, was granted landmark status in May 2013.

The Doelger Building was once the headquarters, warehouse and sales office of homebuilder Henry Doelger. Beginning in the 1920's, and continuing into the 1940's, Doelger built thousands of single-family homes in San Francisco's Sunset District and Daly City's Westlake neighborhood. Doelger homes were built with near-identical floor plans at an affordable price geared towards the middle-class home buyer. By 1940, Doelger had built over two thousand homes, with more than 400 homes sold in 1939 alone.

After purchasing the building in 2012, Geoff Darby began a multi-year restoration process. The façade of the building, including the iconic clock face and entry way, has been restored. The interior of the building has been renovated and divided into four open office suites.

The restoration process was a labor of love for Darby, saying "This was something that needed a lot of TLC" and he wanted to make sure that the person who came in did it properly. Now that the restoration process is complete, Darby is satisfied with the result, "The building has wonderful karma. It is a happy building."

M.Dev.Dev. is the final company to take residence in the historic building, signing a lease on January first, with a full move-in mid-February. Of the move into the building, M.Dev.Dev. principle engineer Jeremi Leasure says, "It is an honor to become a part of the history of the Doelger building." He is also looking forward to doing business in the Inner Sunset, "The 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue corridor is a jewel of SF and will be an impressive backdrop for client meetings."

The San Francisco Botanical Garden was the first organization to sign a lease in January 2015, followed by Five Design and Stapley Hildebrand in June and July of last year.
