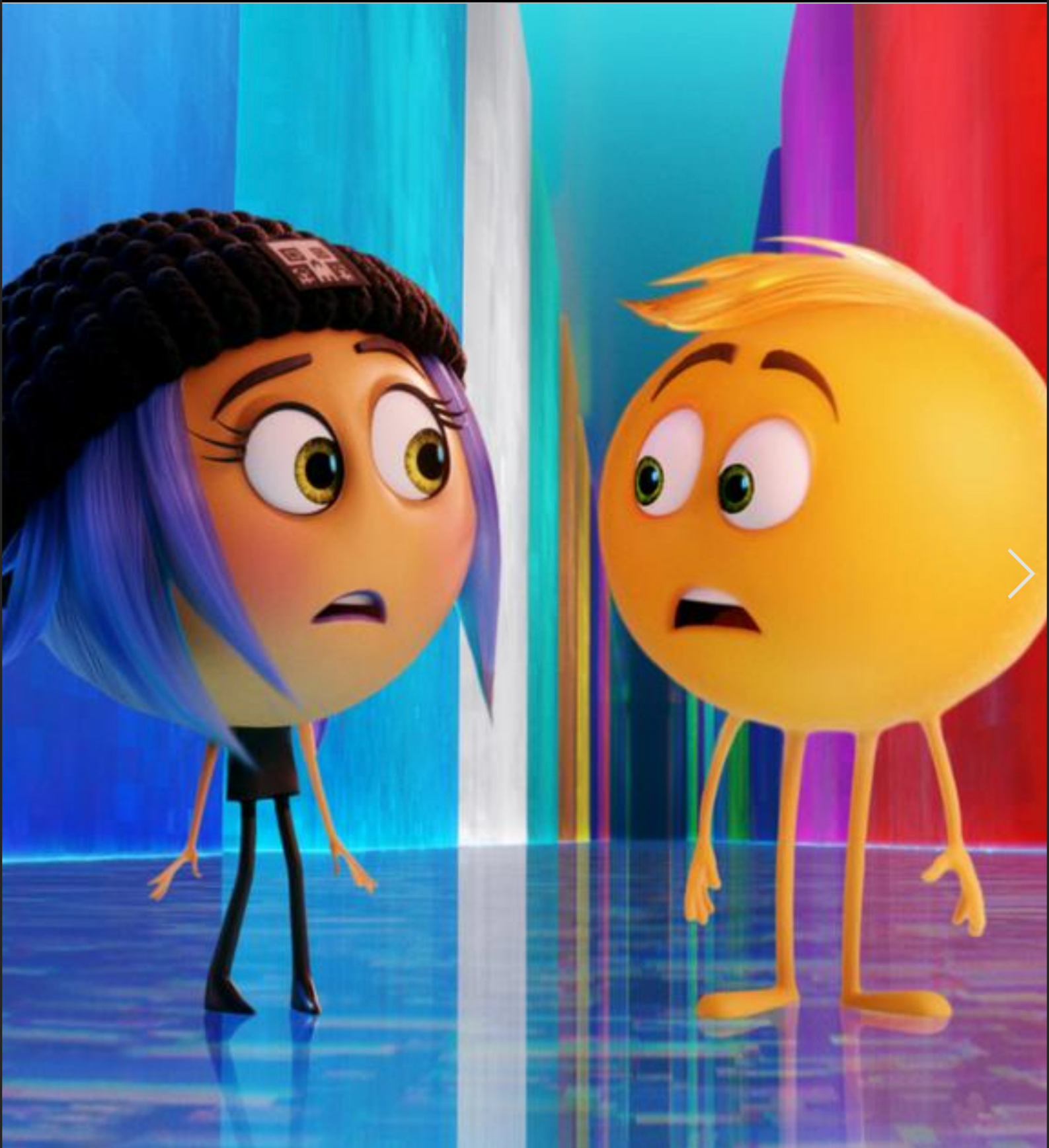


THESE WERE THE 10 WORST MOVIES OF THE 2010S
