# Description of techniques

My main goal for this project was to utilize headings, pictures, chunking, and tables to create a linear path through bulk amounts of information. While the information we were provided was generally helpful, there was no real rhyme or reason to how it was presented. Text and pictures were out of order and generally vague and ambiguous.

The first step was to think like a business owner and create a narrative. I asked myself questions like:

- What is the first thing I want potential customers to see?
- What would potential customers ask?
- In which order should I deliver information to the customer?

I decided to go with the following general outline:

- 1. Who are we?
- 2. Why should you rent a truck?
- 3. What trucks we offer to rent
- 4. Clearly list our fees
- 5. What to know before you rent
- 6. Hours and operation

Once I established this outline, my task was to fill in the blanks using information from the original document as well as do my own digging online. I tried to establish a friendly tone while also being super clear and direct. I also made sure to find opportunities to reference the company name and phone number.

### **SEO**

Aside from finding opportunities to mention the business name and number, I also link the style of vehicle to the manufacturing website. Not only is this a strategic SEO move, but it also gives customers an opportunity to dive deeper into vehicle specs.

## Plain English

Much of the text in the original document was all over the place and often said a lot without saying anything at all. I did a lot of editing, snipping, removing, and updating in order to get right to the point. Personally, I prefer websites/articles that help me find the information that I need and do not spend too much time with background stories.

### Accessibility

For accessibility purposes, I tried to organize my charts and tables using both pictures, data, and bullet points. Readers should be able to easily glance over the document and quickly find the information they need.

I also included two sections that focus on what customers should know about before they come in. It is good business practice to be transparent about pricing, fees, and of course proactively showcasing disqualifications from renting. The hope is that this will save both customer and renting company alike, time when it comes time to exchange and pay the bill.
