Life may be like a box of chocolates, but when shopping for the perfect guy, wouldn't it be great to know if you're gonna get one with nuts? Placing an online personal ad gives thousands of single and not-sosingle men the opportunity to discover

STEP 1: "HI. YOU'LL DO."

First, introduce yourself. While a simple "Hello" or "I'm erect" may work at the club, you'll need something catchier to title your ad. Think of this as your pick-up line. STEP 3: "HI. DO YOU WANNA SEE SOMETHING REALLY SWELL?"

Again, a hot pic will do. Moreover, smile, because, after all, aren't you more likely to approach someone who looks friendly?

Furthermore, rather than offer facts about yourself, share experiences and feelings, like how your heart was shattered when Melrose Place ended.

STEP 5: "HI, WANNA PLAY WAR? YOU CAN BLOW ME AWAY."

Are you versatile? Here's your big chance to demonstrate what roles you're capable of playing... by revealing your hobbies and interests. It's an opportunity for someone else to exclaim, "Hey, I love monster trucking, too!" Don't just mention that you enjoy traveling, watching movies and reading. So do millions of other queers.

Many men will tick off an endless laundry list of hobbies in order to seem well-rounded. The rule is, if you've only played hockey once, that doesn't constitute a hobby. And don't be shy about your drinking, smoking and drug habits. Somewhere out there is a single man in a rehab center just for you.

STEP 6: "HI. I HAD SEX WITH SOMEONE LAST NIGHT. WAS THAT YOU?"

Enough about you. It's time to design the man you lust for: young, rich, cooks gourmet cuisine, writes novels, models when he's not saving lives as an ER doctor, looks like Brad Pitt (wait, that's you), and is best friends with Madonna. Unfortunately, you'll have to settle for less. Don't limit yourself by setting unrealistic expectations or narrow parameters. Remember that your prerequisites shouldn't dominate your ad, so strike a healthy balance between the descriptions of you and the stud you crave.

Note: Sex is natural, sex is fun—but it isn't best for everyone when it's simply one on one. Specify the type of connection you desire, be it friendship, monogamy, an open relationship or just getting off. Also, spend more time describing your turn-ons than turn-offs.

STEP 7: "HI. I'M NO FRED FLINTSTONE, BUT I CAN MAKE YOUR BED ROCK."

If it's too short, he won't feel much; if it's too long, he may want to stop. Don't rush writing your ad. Some people may want to know more than that you're a nice guy looking for another nice guy (duh). On the other hand, providing too much detail is equally

detrimental. While you may find it fascinating that the "Body for Life" regimen reduced your body fat by 6.3 percentage points, you'll only bore others into contemplating, "Gee, that's a really cute puppy in his pic." Additionally, omit whatever you'd tell your shrink, as well as your readiness to date now that your "condition" has finally cleared up. There should be just enough material in your ad to whet the reader's appetite so that he e-mails you for seconds.

STEP 8 "HI. YOU'RE UGLY, BUT YOU INTRIGUE ME."

But don't think about rejection. This should be fun. If you don't chance upon anyone to date or bed, at least you might make some friends—and then date or sleep with *their* pals. See, it's all about networking.

One final thing: after reading your ad, ask: Would I want to meet myself? Uh, only if my photo looks hot.
