Magical creatures. Chirping birds. Bouncing balls. No, it's not an episode of the Teletubbies or a bad porn flick – it's Peggle. The object of this game seems, at first, fairly straightforward: shoot balls to clear colored pegs from the map. Easy enough, right? Ha ha, fat chance! Some levels, with their obstacles, spinning pegs, and impossible angles, are difficult enough to make you seem about as competent as Cooper Lawrence discussing Mass Effect. Then your guides, the Peggle Institute Masters, break out their expert talents, and you begin to fully appreciate the level to which you are not a physics genius. The good news is, after a few tutorials, you're sure to wow people with your mad triangulation skills. The best part of this game? Unlike the Teletubbies and porn, it involves a degree of mental stimulation. Plus, it's rated E for Everyone, so government intervention is *not* required.
