Disdale himself has become a household name in vacht design with his creations now famous for displaying the line between luxury and comfort that is so hard to balance. For RoMEA, the devil is certainly in the detail. 182 finishes make up the interior to include a smorgasbord of exotic woods, marbles, rare metals, glass, and stonework along with bespoke furnishings and unique artworks.

This has all been sympathetically crafted around the huge amount of facilities and a generous layout comprising a vast master suite, VIP stateroom and four further doubles to accommodate up to 12 guests. Like much of RoMEA's design, the amenities on board have been built around the feeling of relaxation. From a Finnish sauna, plunge pool, and indoor and outdoor cinemas to a lower deck beach club and fully equipped luxury spa worthy of the most exclusive resorts on the Riviera, she allows for self-contained comfort at the highest level.
