What Is an API?

APIs are programs that help other programs communicate clearly. They're vital to the microservice models that increasingly drive on-and off-line technology.

Microservice models involve several little independent apps that comprise a bigger application. This model offers many benefits, including efficient coding updates and deployment and seamless user experience, making it a popular option with developers.

For example, Amazon's retail website began life with monolith technological architecture, which meant that any time a tiny section of code needed to be updated, it increased the risk of disrupting code throughout the site.

When Amazon transitioned to the microservice model, their developers identified the units of code that serve the same purpose and wrapped them into single services, such as the buy button or tax calculator. While this model facilitates easy programming updates, it requires APIs to ensure that the different applications talk to each other.

How Does an API Work?

To understand how an API works, consider how the internet functions. All the information and programs that you can find on the internet are hosted on remote servers all over the world. When you search for something, your browser pulls the information from the hosting server, sending the HTML code to load the page for you to see.

In many cases, it isn't necessary to send the full HTML code to answer a query. APIs extract and transmit the little bit of information you actually need.

Imagine that one of your clients is on your website and wants to schedule an appointment. They fill out the form and submit the request, which triggers the creation of a Google calendar event.

When that event is created, the client's internet browser expects to receive the information in HTML, but Google calendar only sends the data, typically provided in a different programming language, to create the event.

An API translates between the two programs, providing seamless event creation.

Benefits of APIs

APIs have much broader applications than scheduling meetings. They connect the programs that you use to set up and fund accounts with the applications that maintain the accounts. An API supports efficient and accurate reporting for you and your clients.
