



Feeding Program Share a Smile believes that education is essential to one's life. To motivate the students, we aim to provide them with materials they need to study.

We support their education by giving them a backpack with school materials specific to their grade levels.





Share a Smile reaches out to distant tribal communities with scarce electricity sources.

We alleviate this concern by giving a solar-powered lamp to each family of the tribe which they can use at night as they do their house chores, continue their studies, and for emergencies.
