PACKAGING REQUIREMENTS OF CBD IN EU MARKET

THE LAW

- > European Commission has recognized Cannabidiol or CBD as a "Novel Food."
- >Considered as a Novel Food, any product containing CBD can only be placed on the European Union market only after the Commission has processed an application for the authorisation of a novel food, and has adopted an implementing act authorising the placing on the market of a novel food and updating the Union list. Thus, before placing a novel food on the European Union market, the applicant must first submit to the Commission an online application for authorisation.

Overall Packaging Requirements

- (a) the name of the food
- (b) the list of ingredients
- (c) the quantity of certain ingredients or categories of ingredients
- (e) the net quantity of the food
- (f) the date of minimum durability or the 'use by' date
- (g) any special storage conditions and/or conditions of

use

Overall Packaging Requirements

- (h) the name or business name and address of the company
- (i) the country of origin or place of provenance
- (j) instructions for use where it would be difficult to make appropriate use of the food in the absence of such instructions
- (I) a nutrition declaration

E-Cigarettes Packaging Requirements in EU

- (a) health warnings for e-cigarettes advising consumers that they contain nicotine and should not be used by non-smokers are mandatory.
- (b) list of ingredients contained in the product
- (c) information on the product's nicotine content,
- (d) leaflet with instructions for use and information on adverse effects, risk groups, addictiveness and toxicity
- (e) promotional elements are not allowed on e-cigarette packaging, and cross-border advertising and promotion of e-cigarettes is prohibited.

Application Procedure for Selling CBD Products in EU

- 1. Register and submit an application on https://ec.europa.eu/food/safety/novel-food/e-submission-en.
- 2. EFSA will adopt its opinion in 9 months from the date of receipt of a valid application from the Commission.
- 3. Within the seven months from the date of the publication of the EFSA's opinion, the Commission shall submit to the Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed a draft implementing act authorising the placing on the market of a novel food and updating the Union list.
- 4. Once the act receives a favourable vote from the Standing Committee and is adopted and published by the Commission, the novel food can be lawfully placed on the European Union market.
