Gender inequality, according to savethechildren.org, means "discrimination on the basis of sex or gender, causing one sex or gender to be routinely privileged or prioritized over another". Gender inequality exists all around the world, and it's very easy to spot.

There are many forms of gender inequality. Discrimination towards the LGBT+ community is still rampant and extremely common. Sadly, being on the spectrum of LGBT+ comes with a lot of disadvantages. By 2017, being gay was still illegal in 72 countries.

LGBT people also face many problems because of their sexual orientation, whether it's internal or external. For example, the difficulty of coming out, social stigma, bullying, abuse (verbal, mental, and physical), the risk of being disowned or kicked out by their family, corrective rape, conversion therapy, oppressive law, the risk of being fired from their job, and so on.

As a minority group, the LGBT+ community is vulnerable to unpleasant and oppressive treatment. This affects their mental health and even life expectancy.


