Yet another disheartening situation ensued, in September 2018 Adegor Okpako a staff sergeant attached to 192 battalion in gwoza killed another sergeant injured four of his colleagues and killed himself.

Just this year (2020) more than Five hundred soldiers have been killed, with mention to the recent deadly Ambush attack in March where more than 300 soldiers were killed (eye witness report) The list of these depravities is endless with the incessant killings of civilians and detainment of Children and minors by the boko haram terrorists. Till the time of writing this article, the federal government has failed to bring back our girls. Snatched from us for so long a time.

To this effect the dumbest strategy deployed by the federal government in handling the insurgency is by initiating a safe corridor granting amnesty to "repentant" boko haram members and establish an agency to rehabilitate and reintegrate these inhumane insurgents back to the society, with no consideration to the greater harm they may pose being insiders.
