

ANIMALS



The brown hare can run up to 77 km/h due to their powerful back legs. They can be found mainly around farmland in parts of Europe and Asia. In addition to being very fast, they also have 360° vision, which means they can detect predators from all directions.

SAILFISH

The sailfish swims at 110 km/h, making it the world's fastest fish. This is all thanks to their massive fins that look and act like the sail of a boat. Their massive fins are often folded down, which helps them swim faster and more efficiently. Because they are overfished, sailfish do not grow as large as they used to. They have shrunk from being 3 m long to now being 1.5 m.



OSTRICH

The world's largest bird, the ostrich, is also the fastest two-legged land animal. Ostriches can't fly, but they can sprint at 70 km/h for up to 30 minutes, using their two toes on each foot. They will also use their powerful legs (which are strong enough to kill) to kick any predators.

SPRINGBOK

Not to be confused with the rugby team, springboks are also the national animal of South Africa and one of the fastest animals alive. Plus they're great jumpers! Springboks zoom at about a speed of 88 km/h, and can leap 2-3 metres when running and bounding.
