Known in her circle as the producer who never backs down and never gives up, Earle says, "Pain is all a part of the journey, and that's why I love writing stories so much. 
is in what is painful, but at the same time, it's what makes us stronger and more determined." Earle explains, "As a producer, I've dealt with having to roll with the punches. I told myself
