laws too vaguely.



Some cases of cyber-harassment became big news stories. In 2018, a 12-year old Panama City, Florida girl named Gabriella Green, hanged herself with a dog leash. Police arrested her bullies, a 12 boy and girl, and charged them with cyberbullying.

Before their arrest, the girl who tormented her spread rumors that Gabriella contracted STD's and made threats that she would expose "personal and sensitive details" about her life.

The 12-year boy who was arrested video-chatted Gabriella Green. After learning of Green's previous suicide attempt, he told her, "If you're going to do it, just do it."

Gabriella's mother hopes that her death will shine a light on cyberbullying cases so that others take it seriously.


Sameer Hinduja, a criminology professor at Florida Atlantic University and co-director of the Cyberbullying Research Center, conducted a cyberbullying study. According to his findings, one in three kids say that cyberbullies victimized them. The study also mentions that twelve percent of children bullied others online.

The case that brought Masquerading to national prominence is that of Megan Meier. Meier, a 13-year-old girl, who committed suicide after being bullied by fifty-nine-year-old Lori Drew. Drew developed an online relationship with Megan Meier by claiming to be a teenage boy. Police charged Drew, but a jury acquitted her.

Catfishing is a similar concept to that of Masquerading. Catfishing "refers to a person who creates a fake online profile in order to fraudulently seduce someone. It has also become a verb to refer to the act of doing so."

A famous case of Catfishing is that of Nev Schulman. In his 2010 documentary Catfish, Schulman tracks the girl with whom he is in an online relationship. At the end of the documentary, he discovers his girlfriend is forty and married.
