Hair accessories of every sporty, flowery, bijoux variety on the Fall 2015 runways: the loot and how to wear 'em

The Fall 2015 flashy runways were resplendent with hair accessories of all shapes and sizes, backstage baubles that really rocked the boat and added that much more flair to the hairdos conjured backstage. From geometric clips at Suno to monochromatic leather ties at Carolina Herrera and hairbands galore at Chanel, the only rule was they looked better pinned into easy, simple, imperfectly done hair. The three true standouts of the season were the twinkling accoutrements at Prada, piled high ponytails secured at the side with sparkly, bloomlike baubles which Guido Palau said “just elevates and lifts the entire look.” At Rochas, Paul Hanlon fastened barrettes in matte black and khaki to ultra-sleek, side-parted strands, musing: “What’s nice is, because it doesn’t go around the whole perimeter of the hair, only about 70 percent of it, what you’re left with on the sides blows when they walk.” And the completely fab, un-ignorable flowery, glitzy ornaments nestled in every model’s updo at Dolce & Gabbana, from pearl hairbands to flowery clips, gold flourishes and chunky oversized brooches. “The idea is that you’ve put ’50s brooches and pearls in your hair from your mother’s trinket box,” said Palau, and we could all do the same—pick whatever fits your fancy, go for a laid-back, uncomplicated style and pin away. **mc**
