The American-Scandinavian Foundation (ASF) serves as a vital educational and cultural link between the United States and the five Nordic countries: Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden. A publicly supported nonprofit organization, the Foundation fosters cultural understanding, provides a forum for the exchange of ideas, and sustains an extensive program of fellowships, grants, internships/training, publishing, and cultural events. Over 30,000 Scandinavians and Americans have participated in its exchange programs over the last century.

In October 2000, ASF inaugurated its headquarters, Scandinavia House: The Nordic Center in America, where it presents a broad range of public programs furthering its mission to reinforce the strong relationships between the United States and the Nordic nations, honoring their shared values and appreciating their differences.

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A NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT— EDWARD P. GALLAGHER

The following pages provide an overview of the programs, activities and finances of the American-Scandinavian Foundation for the fiscal years of 2022, 2023 and 2024. These years are unlike any others in the recent past, marked as they were by the ongoing disruptions of the Covid-19 pandemic and the subsequent challenges in returning to "normal" operations.

Founded 114 years ago to increase international understanding and cooperation through educational and cultural exchange, the American-Scandinavian Foundation continues to pursue this mission with great vigor and dedication. In the three fiscal years covered in this report, more than 190 fellowships, grants and special awards were presented to scientists, scholars, artists, writers, musicians and students. These funds enabled them to advance their education, research and creative efforts in the Nordic countries and in the United States. In addition, 41 public project grants were made in support of artistic, cultural and educational programs.

The ASF Internship and Training Program, suspended during the pandemic, resumed full operations in 2022. Its recovery has yet to reach pre-Covid levels, but it continues to grow. More than 120 young professionals and students participated in our Internship and Training Program over the past three years, enjoying the opportunity to receive invaluable practical experience while living and working in the United States.

Scandinavia House resumed full operations over the course of 2022, with an extensive schedule of concerts, film screenings lectures, symposia, language classes and children's activities. A number of these in-person programs were also available on-line in many cases This "virtual Scandinavia House" initiated during the pandemic lock-down, has greatly expanded our national and international audiences. During Fiscal Years 2022,2023, and 2024, over 300 live and virtual programs were presented and enjoyed by tens of thousands of viewers.

Particular program highlights were the exhibitions offered in our Galleries. These included On The Arctic Edge — Artists Explore the Far North, presenting the work of photo-based artists and fellows Marion Belanger, Clare Benson, and Steve Giovinco (Fall 2022-Spring 2023); Arctic Highways — Works By Twelve Indigenous Artists From Sápmi, Canada And Alaska (Spring/Summer 2023); Narrative Threads: Works by Eight Nordic Artists (Fall 2023-Spring 2024); and Fog-Swept Cargo — Art From the Faroe Islands (Spring/Summer 2024), which was presented alongside the celebration "Fog Swept Islands: Faroe Islands Culture Days."

It has been a memorable three years, distinguished by a number of notable accomplishments. This would not have been possible without the leadership of the ASF Trustees and the generous support of our many members and friends. We are deeply grateful to them, as well as to the ASF staff who have worked with such dedication during this period.

FELLOWSHIPS & GRANTS

For more than 100 years, ASF's Fellowships & Grants Program has awarded funds to Americans and Scandinavians engaged in study, research, or creative arts projects. In 1912, the first ASF grants were made to three Americans conducting research in philology and literature at Scandinavian institutions, and four Scandinavians studying naval architecture, economics, and library sciences at American institutions. ASF's 1912 Fellows helped advance the newly established Foundation's mission to promote educational and cultural exchange between the U.S. and the Nordic countries. Since then, more than 7,500 scholars, researchers, policymakers, artists, and professionals have received support for their work in areas now as far-ranging as medicine and the sciences, economics and political history, the arts, and literature.

More than 190 Scandinavian and American Fellows received financial support from ASF for study and research projects in the three years covered in this report. In 2021-22, \$827,076 was awarded to 63 fellows from the U.S. and the Nordic countries; in 2022-2023, \$810,035 was granted to 64 fellows; and in 2023-2024, \$714,560 was given to 64 fellows. Fellowships range between \$2,000 and \$23,000 and are conferred upon graduate students, post-graduate scholars, professionals, and artists pursuing independent projects.

In 2017, ASF initiated two programs to support
Scandinavian folk arts and cultural traditions in the
Upper Midwest (defined as North Dakota, South Dakota,
Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin, and the Upper Peninsula
of Michigan): Folk Arts Fellowships and Public Program/
Community Project Grants. These programs recognize
and celebrate the mastery of individual artists and
practitioners, facilitate the cultivation of skills and
understanding of Scandinavian traditions among

younger generations, bring greater visibility to the arts, and highlight the importance of cultural expression to all our lives. The programs further ASF's goal of celebrating and nurturing Nordic (Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, Sápmi, and Sweden) cultures throughout the United States. During 2021-2022, seven artists received \$62,125 in fellowships, and four organizations received \$118,800 in grants for public programs and community projects; in 2022-23, \$58,450 was awarded in fellowships to eight artists, and \$119,425 was given to five public programs; and for 2023-24, \$78,875 was awarded to eight artists, and \$170,030 was granted to nine public programs.



The American-Scandinavian Foundation's Internship & Training Program facilitates cultural and educational exchange between the United States and the five Nordic countries. During the three-year period covered by this report, ASF welcomed 123 young Scandinavians to the United States to participate in internships and training programs in 22 states. Our participant numbers are slowly making their way to pre-COVID-19 levels.

Our students and young professional participants are able to gain meaningful experience within many different industries ranging from architecture to robotics to international business and marketing. Each participant is welcomed by the host firm as a member of the team and receives a direct, personal introduction to American practices in his or her professional field. Designated by the U.S. Department of State, ASF provides J-1 visa sponsorship for these ambitious participants, making it possible for them to acquire hands-on experience and gain new skills and knowledge. ASF has welcomed more than 16,000 interns and trainees since initiating this program in 1949. Scandinavian interns and trainees gain valuable professional experience and build beneficial relationships, while learning American business techniques to be applied in their home countries. ASF is grateful to the many American businesses and organizations that have made it possible for these interns and trainees to have this experience.



SCANDINAVIA HOUSE PROGRAMS

Each year the American-Scandinavian Foundation presents more than 150 cultural and educational programs at Scandinavia House: The Nordic Center in America. In addition to serving as the headquarters for ASF, Scandinavia House is a showcase for Nordic culture and a forum for the exchange of ideas and information. Beginning in 2020, Scandinavia House also began offering a range of virtual programs, including digital exhibitions and visual art programs; virtual film screenings and film talks; virtual panels, lectures, and book talks; virtual children's workshops, read-alouds, and holiday crafts; and an online book club.

EXHIBITIONS

The American–Scandinavian Foundation presents museum–quality exhibitions at Scandinavia House that highlight excellent artistic achievements in the Nordic countries, covering both historical and contemporary subjects in a wide variety of media. Exhibitions at Scandinavia House are presented in the third floor galleries: Stolt–Nielsen Gallery; Inger G. and William Ginsberg Gallery; Hartvig and Olette Gundersen Gallery; and Leif Höegh Gallery. With the 2020 closure of our galleries due to the COVID pandemic, ASF began to produce virtual visual art programming, including Scandinavia House's first interactive digital exhibition Conversations with a Shipwreck in 2021.

Conversations with a Shipwreck: Digital Exhibition THU-3-24-2021 THROUGH TUE-9-7-2021

The first interactive digital exhibition presented by Scandinavia House, *Conversations with a Shipwreck* was a multimedia meditation on the Swedish warship Vasa, created in a unique collaboration of word and image

by ASF Fellows Joan Wickersham and Adam Davies. Through presentations of poems and large-format photographs, with short durational video and audio, this digital art and literary exhibition responded to the legendary warship — which sank only minutes into her maiden voyage — exploring themes of memory and oblivion, technological triumph and fiasco, permanence and impermanence, mortality and time. The exhibition also highlighted the ASF Fellowships & Grants programs, which demonstrate the Foundation's longstanding commitment to educational cultural exchange.

Edvard Munch's Photography: The Experimental Self FRI-12-10-2021 THROUGH SAT-3-26-22

The Experimental Self: Edvard Munch's Photography, an exhibition organized by ASF with The Munch Museum in Oslo that first brought the photographic work of the master painter to NYC in 2017/18 before traveling worldwide, returned to Scandinavia House with a newly conceived design including vintage camera equipment alongside the release of the 2020 illustrated book The Experimental Self: The Photography of Edvard Munch, awarded with diploma as one of The Year's Most Beautiful Books, 2021 by Grafill, Norway's National Organization for Visual Communication. Internationally celebrated for his paintings, prints, and watercolors, The exhibition introduced audiences to the photographic and film work of Norwegian artist Edvard Munch (1863–1944), emphasizing the artist's experimentalism.

On the Arctic Edge — Artists Explore the Far North presented three contemporary photo-based artists whose work traverses the regions of the Arctic Circle to probe themes ranging from time and memory, to landscape and the built environment, to science and mythology, to our changing climate: Marion Belanger, Clare Benson, and Steve Giovinco. Works included Benson's Until There Is No Sun, a poetic investigation of the Arctic's duality; Belanger's Rift/Fault series studying land-based tectonic edges; and the lyrical night landscapes of Giovinco's Inertia series. Each artist received financial support from the American-Scandinavian Foundation from funds donated by Scandinavian Seminar.

Arctic Highways — Works by Twelve Indigenous Artists from Sápmi, Canada and Alaska SAT-4-15-23 THROUGH SAT-7-22-23

Arctic Highways brought together the artwork and handicrafts of 12 Indigenous artists from Sápmi, Canada and Alaska in an exhibition highlighting the thriving cultural and spiritual communities of the Arctic region. Curated by Indigenous artists Tomas Colbengtson, Gunvor Guttorm, Dan Jåma and Britta Marakatt-Labba, the exhibition included their own works alongside those of artists Matti Aikio, Marja Helander, Laila Susanna Kuhmunen, Olof Marsja, Máret Ánne Sara, Sonya Kelliher-Combs, Maureen Gruben and Meryl McMaster. The exhibition featured a wide range of artworks and duodji (Sámi handicrafts) including Britta Marakatt-Labba's narrative embroidery; sculpture works by Máret Ánne Sara; handmade clothing and sculpture works; mixed-media sculptures; and Tomas Colbengtson's The Children of the Sun.

ASF GOLD MEDAL

The American-Scandinavian Foundation's highest honor is its Gold Medal. It recognizes the achievements of persons or institutions, consonant with the mission and objectives of the Foundation. In 2023, the ASF Gold Medal was awarded to the Metropolitan Opera, acknowledging its unique history of introducing, mentoring, and promoting brilliant musical artists from the Nordic countries, as well as for nurturing the talents of young artists from around the world for 140 years.

ASF CULTURAL AWARD

The ASF Cultural Award pays tribute to individuals or organizations whose achievement in the fields of art and culture has significantly promoted understanding between the United States and the Nordic region. Recent awardees include the renowned architect, James Stewart Polshek, who in 2022 was recognized for his creative vision and deep appreciation of the Nordic aesthetic, which culminated in his design for Scandinavia House: The Nordic Center in America. In 2023, Ambassador John L. Loeb, Jr. was recognized for his accomplishments as a visionary collector, and for his dedicated efforts to foster appreciation of Danish art in the United States through his generous support of publications, lectures, and fellowships. Craig Dykers and Elaine Molinar, two of the founders of the international architecture, landscape, and design studio Snøhetta, were honored in 2024 for their distinctive architectural vision and their achievements in building cultural bridges that promoted Nordic design aesthetics and values through their work in the United States and abroad.

ASF NIELS POULSON AWARD

The Niels Poulson Award, named after ASF's founder, recognizes outstanding dedication and service by a Trustee to the Foundation, andits promotion of educational, cultural, and professional exchanges between the U.S. and the Nordic countries. Lena Biörck Kaplan was honored in 2022 for her dedication to the mission of ASF, her leadership as President from 1989 to

1996, and her efforts to make ASF's vision of a Nordic cultural center, Scandinavia House, into a reality. In 2024, Thor Thors, Jr. was recognized for his dedication and devotion to the mission of ASF for half a century. He is one of the longest serving ASF Executive Trustees and was honored for his loyalty and exceptional commitment to the Foundation.

BIRGIT NILSSON AWARD

The Birgit Nilsson Award was established in 1988, the 350th anniversary of New Sweden, the first Swedish settlement in the U.S. The Award was endowed through proceeds of a concert honoring the world-renowned Swedish soprano Birgit Nilsson. It is awarded to a finalist in the Metropolitan Opera Auditions, one of the most prestigious competitions for young singers in the world. Alexandra Razskazoff was the recipient of the 2022 Birgit Nilsson Award, Teresa Perotta was the recipient in 2023, and Emily Richter received the award in 2024.

ASF TRANSLATION PRIZES

Established in 1980, ASF Translation Prizes are awarded annually for English translations of prose or poetry written by Nordic authors born after 1800. Recent Nadia Christensen Prize recipients include Randi Ward in 2021, for her translation from the Faroese of a work by Kim Simonsen; Rachel Willson-Broyles, 2022, for an excerpt of Aris Fioretos' Mary (Mary, Swedish); and Mia Spangenberg, 2023, for an excerpt of Pirkko Saisio's Pienin yhteinen jaettava (Lowest Common Denominator, Finnish). Recent recipients of the Leif and Inger Sjöberg Prize include Hunter Simpson in 2021 (Stine Pilgaard's Meter i sekundet (The Land of Short Sentences, Danish)); Jennifer Kwon Dobbs in 2022 (Niillas Holmberg's Juolgevuoððu (Underfoot, Sámi)) and Rachel Britton in 2023 (Brynja Hjálmsdóttir's Kona lítur við (Woman Creature, Icelandic)). In 2022, the Wigeland Prize was awarded to Wendy Gabrielsen. In 2023, the Inger and Jens Bruun Translation Prize, supported by the Scan Design Foundation, was awarded to Misha Hoekstra.

SCANDINAVIAN REVIEW

ASF's flagship publication is *Scandinavian Review*, an illustrated journal that presents many aspects of life and culture in the Nordic countries through articles on contemporary and historical issues as well as on new developments in the region. Published continuously since 1913, *Scandinavian Review* also presents excerpts from winning entries in ASF's annual Translation Prize competition, and a New Nordic Book Tips section. Since 2021 the publication has been edited by Lori Fredrickson.

Spring/Summer 2021

The cover feature explored Helsinki's award-winning new flagship library, Oodi, which opened in late 2018. Other articles included a feature on the anniversary of Denmark's 1920 reunification with the South Jutland border region; a photo essay exploring Iceland's rural past; the history of an unlikely cultural circle forged within Norway's WWII prison camps; and an article on ASF's first digital exhibition, *Conversations with a Shipwreck*.

Fall/Winter 2021

The cover feature looked at the eruptions of the Geldingadalir region of Iceland, and how melting ice caps indicate a more dynamic volcanic future. Other articles explored new insights into women warriors of the Viking Age; the new Munch Museum in Oslo; the 1991 Soviet coup's impact on Finland and its implications today; Sweden's Trollhättan or "Trollywood," headquarters of many acclaimed film productions; and how Indigenous voices are shaping the Arctic's climate debate.

Spring/Summer 2022

The cover feature of this issue introduced the new Hans Christian Andersen museum in Odense, Denmark, whose magical design has enchanted visitors of all ages. Other articles explored the history of Scandinavian migration and multiculturalism amid a new refugee crisis in Europe; a look back at Finland's storied history of classical music;

a photo essay of the Nordic response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine; and an excerpt from *Secrets of the Sprakkar* by First Lady of Iceland Eliza Reid.

Fall/Winter 2022

The cover feature, "Turning Up The Heat," explored the revitalization of sauna culture throughout the Nordic countries. Other articles examined the new redesign of the National Museum of Art, Architecture and Design in Oslo; the evolution of Scandinavian security policies in the months following Russia's invasion of the Ukraine; the 60th anniversary of the Nordic Council Literature Prize; and the exhibition *On the Arctic Edge*.

Spring/Summer 2023

The cover feature of this issue looked at new art developments in Helsinki, including the 2023 Helsinki Biennial and the triennial *Generation 2023* at Amos Rex. Other articles explored a potential fossil-free future in the Nordic countries; the benefits of compromise and consensus in Nordic multi-party democracies; the 80th anniversary of Denmark's WWII rescue of its Jewish community; and the exhibition *Arctic Highways*.

Fall/Winter 2023

The cover feature, "Discoveries of the Depths," examined the work of scientists from the Norwegian Polar Institute in the far north of Svalbard, and their race to document a disappearing ecosystem. Other articles explored a preservation effort working to revitalize Scandinavian heritage churches throughout the Midwest; the long and vibrant history of Finland's second-largest city Tampere; and the 2023 show *Narrative Threads*.

SCAN

The American–Scandinavian Foundation also publishes a quarterly newsletter, *SCAN*, which reports on ASF's activities and programs, along with news from the Nordic region and Scandinavian events throughout the United States.

SPRING GALA 2022

The ASF Niels Poulson Award, recognizing outstanding dedication and service by a member of the Board of Trustees, was presented to Lena Biörck Kaplan. An Executive Trustee since 1984, Mrs. Kaplan also served as President of the organization from 1989–1996. During her tenure she spearheaded the efforts to establish a Nordic cultural center in New York. Her vision, enthusiasm, and tenacity were crucial in convincing the Board of Trustees to commit to creating Scandinavia House, which included extensive public spaces to present Scandinavia culture and society to a broad and diverse audience, along with a new headquarters for ASF.



Lena Kaplan has also served ASF as both Vice Chairman for Sweden and a member of the Executive Committee from 2000-2012, and as Deputy Chair in 2006.

Renowned architect James Stewart Polshek received the ASF Cultural Award, which pays tribute to individuals or organizations whose achievement in the fields of art and culture has significantly furthered understanding between the United States and the Scandinavian countries. Mr. Polshek's career spans six decades and his firm, Polshek Partnership, was selected from nearly 20 applicants to be the architect for Scandinavia House: The Nordic Center in America. Mr. Polshek received a Master of Architecture degree from Yale University in 1955, and subsequently spent a year in Denmark at the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Art on a Fulbright/Hays Fellowship. There he developed a deep understanding of and appreciation for the Nordic design aesthetic — which informed much of his later work. Among Mr. Polshek's most well-known projects are the Rose Center for Earth and Space at the American Museum of Natural History, the Carnegie Hall renovation and Zankel Hall expansion, The Santa Fe Opera Theater, and the Clinton Presidential Center in Little Rock, Arkansas.
