Chess is an ancient, beautiful game played between two players on a square board, it is made up of 64 squares, with two interchanging dark and light colors. Each player has a king, queen, 2 rooks, 2 bishops, 2 knights, and 8 pawns.

Despite amassing great players such as Bobby Fischer that reigned supreme within 1960-1970, the U.S. did not have a specific day celebrating chess devotees, competitors, and the beauty of the game until the 38th president of the United States, Gerald Ford declared October 9, 1976, the National Chess Day which is celebrated annually.

He was not a chess player but he acknowledged the importance of chess asserting that it sharpened the mind and encouraged healthy competition. National Chess Day is a day to celebrate chess enthusiasts, the history of chess, how chess has connected people around the world and changed many lives.

Chess can be dated back to the sixth century and is said to emerge from India, found its way to Persia, was adopted by the Muslim community and subsequently southern Europe. One of the earliest forms of chess was a war game called Chaturanga from India and gradually evolved into Chaturanga two-player game.

The first international chess tournament was held in 1851 and by the nineteenth century, chess had become a modern-day sport. The United States chess federation is the body that regulates

chess in the United States, a representative of FIDE (Fédération Internationale des Echés) in the U.S.
