

Two programs provide a broad range of options

Apprentices at the San Diego Electrical Training Center choose between two different tracks of study, both of which lead to many career possibilities.

1. Electrician

The course of study to become a traditional electrician, often referred to as an "inside wireperson," is a demanding program that takes about five years to complete. In this program, you will learn to work with virtually every type of electrical system, including high-voltage and solar. You could ultimately

work in a broad range of environments, including power generation, industrial manufacturing, and commercial construction.

2. Telecommunications Specialist

This program is geared around electronic building systems, often described as the "nerve centers" of today's business environments. In the electrical industry, this is referred to as low-voltage work.

Most apprentices complete this program in four years and often end up working in hi-tech settings. With this training, you might install and maintain life-safety equipment for hospitals, design and implement complex building automation systems, or create sophisticated networks for audio and visual communications.
