Buffalo fans everywhere are gearing up for a 'make or break' season after the Bills finished out their pre-season taking down the Green Bay Packers 19-0. With most Green Bay's first-string players benched, back-up quarterback Jordan Love and his team struggled to put points on the board. On the other side of the field, Josh Allen dominated the air, making key plays with returning players, Gabriel Davis, and Cole Beasley, in addition to new faces on the team such as Emmanuel Sanders.

Josh Allen and his Buffalo Bills have proved a force to be reckoned this preseason; storming onto the field, scoring a touchdown on their opening drive, and keeping that momentum throughout the game, even when the starters came off the field. Packers running backs, AJ Dillon and Kylin Hill, were frequently utilized by Love and both making seven carries, with Hill rushing for total of 37 yards and Dillon rushing for a total of 18 yards. In the end however, the Packers ultimately came up short with several drives being stopped on Buffalo's side of the fifty-yard line, and even one interception being made by Bills' safety, Micah Hyde.
