▶ New service for Gustavus and Gulf of Alaska

The [Marine Highway](#) is pleased to announce it will offer sailings to southeast Alaska's [Gustavus](#) for the first time starting monthly in November. Gustavus service will run weekly starting in May and twice-weekly, beginning in June. The new service will connect you to travel opportunities in Glacier Bay National Park. In addition, the Kennicott will provide new cross-gulf service every other week as it travels between Bellingham, Wash., and Whittier, with stops in Ketchikan and Juneau.

▶ Take the ferry to explore historic haunts

That chill in the air isn't just the turning of seasons. It's the thrill of spooky adventures you can find in Alaska's historic and haunted locations that will inspire goosebumps along with good times. Take the [Alaska Marine Highway](#) to visit these haunted connections:

Skagway: Built in 1898, the Golden North Hotel has a few long-time patrons, including "Mary," who some say is the ghost of a woman who died of pneumonia waiting for her fiancé to return from gold prospecting. Rooms are dedicated to gold rush families and filled with mementos and antiques.

Juneau: Juneau's Alaskan Hotel, formerly a bordello, is the site of apparition who some say is a miner's sweetheart whom he killed when he returned after a long spell of prospecting. In addition, the Historic Silverbow Inn features a bakery on site, where patrons sometimes see the kind spirit of a boy as they enjoy their breakfast bagels.

Anchorage: Further north, the nearly 100-year-old Historic Anchorage Hotel reports so many unusual events that they keep a "ghost log." Ghostly guests include a jilted bride and a small child.
