Computer Science

 The next cycle of the Computer Science Education Grant is expected to start in mid-October, with applications due in November. Mathematics

- After a summer featuring <u>Teaching and Learning CoLabs</u>, <u>NCSM's</u>
 <u>Summer Leadership Academy</u>, and <u>CCTM's Teaching for Thinking Learning Institute</u>, the 2023-24 school year is off to a strong and promising start:
 - Nearly all the grantees of the <u>ESSER K-8</u> and <u>ESSER K-12</u> math curricula grants have received their materials and/or professional development.
 - The Colorado Math Leaders held its first meeting on Sept. 12, with 30 people in attendance, the largest attendance in at least eight years.
 - The Colorado Council of Teachers of Mathematics is starting a Teaching for Thinking book study that will continue monthly

Improving Mathematics Outcomes in K-12 legislation.
 CMAS results show positive movement in mathematics,

although there's still a lot of work to do.

CDE's accountability team is conducting regional support visits and is prepared to share information and answer questions about how HB 23-1231 impacts Unified Improvement Planning.

The USSYP is for high school students interested in pursuing careers in public service. Each delegate will be awarded a \$10,000 college scholarship for undergraduate studies, with encouragement to pursue coursework in history and political science.
