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Standards Review and Revision

Computer Science Standards drafts to be reviewed by State Board of Education

The Committee for the Computer Science Standards Review and Revision completed a draft for the proposed revisions and additions to the current Colorado Academic Standards for Computer Science. The committee followed recommendations from the State Board of Education to review a benchmarking report from McREL to address gaps in our current standards.

Highlights of the new draft include two new standards focusing on artificial intelligence and cybersecurity. The State Board of Education will review the standards draft with public comment beginning at around 10 a.m. Wednesday, Nov. 8, at the State Board of Education boardroom at 201 E. Colfax Ave. Denver.
