


## Capturing a Flamenco in Concert

he Flamenco music is an individualistic and structured folk art from Andalusia. It is often spontaneous and is based on a great deal of improvisation. It is a harmonic structure that creates excitement when the dancers, singer and the musicians respond to each other simultaneously. Flamenco reflects the hard times that the people have gone through like war, discrimination, expulsion from rulers and other social tensions. It expresses the feelings of the people in various situations and is very personal.

A guitarist, composer and an artistic mentor to his ensemble, he began learning guitar at the age of six and made his first performance at the age of 12. Paco Pena has performed in many countries since then, which includes London, New Zealand, Germany. Amsterdam, Singapore, Australia, Japan and Hong Kong.



Paco Pena founded the Centro Flamenco Paco Pena m 1981, and became the world's first Professor of Clamenco Guitar at the Rotterdam Conservatory in Netherlands: As a recognition for his accomplishments, Paco Pena was given the Official de la Cruz de la Orden del Merito Civil by King Juan Carlos of Spain.
