Local Youth Cast to Perform Unabridged Production of Into the Woods

BEN LOMOND, Calif., January 27, 2015—Spotlight Youth Conservatory is pleased to announce its debut production, *Into the Woods*, the Tony-Award-winning musical where favorite fairytale characters navigate real-world moral dilemmas. The show runs from February 20 through March 1 at Park Hall in Ben Lomond.

A Disney film adaptation with Meryl Streep and Johnny Depp premiered in December of 2014, becoming a box office hit. Now, a new generation of talented young actors is ready to bring *Into the Woods* back to the stage, and into the forested mountain setting of Ben Lomond, where this tale should be told.

"These young artists bear their hearts and souls on stage," says Ceglio. "It is sure to be a meaningful experience for our audience."

Into the Woods runs from Feb. 20 to March 1 at Park Hall in Ben Lomond, Calif.
