
Because of You, our palliative care team made **776** palliative care visits to patients.

Our team of doctors, registered nurses, chaplains, social workers, certified nursing assistants and volunteers enter a person's life when they have a terminal illness and a prognosis of less than six months to live. While we cannot change those circumstances, we can bring our sensitivity and highly

skilled care to their home and make their remaining days richer, warmer and more meaningful. We are committed to meeting the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of our patients and their loved ones.

# Our Home Health Care Keeping Mountain Residents Happy & Healthy > Home

ur home health care services allow patients to receive medical care in their own homes as they recover from illnesses and hospitalizations or heal from surgeries.

This year, the demand for our nurses, physical, occupational and speech therapists, certified nursing assistants and social workers increased by 41 percent. Our home health care teams met that need by traveling hundreds of miles every week, helping mountain residents stay safe, sound and largely sovereign in their own homes.

# Caring for Our Community Healing the Heart

ount Evans was created by, and for, our community. Our outreach programs are designed to promote connectedness and well-being among our neighbors, particularly as they face life's painful and unexpected challenges.

Mountain Journey provided support, counseling and education to 58 mountain residents coping with illness or isolation.

Our Caregiver and Bereavement Support programs helped **858** people in need by providing individual counseling, support groups, resources, workshops, and assistance with long-term planning.

Camp Comfort helped **50** children, grieving the loss of a family member, heal their broken hearts.

The ability to talk about it changed everything for me. Coming back to Camp Comfort as a counselor means the world to me. I care deeply about all of the kids. Freedom **5K** Run More than **800** runners participated in the 38th Annual 4th of July tradition and raised more than **\$63,000** to support our patients and families. This event is a family-oriented celebration that has become a tradition for many in our mountain community. We are very grateful for the generous community sponsors who support this event and to the volunteers who make it happen.
