- Providing sustenance in collaboration with All Faiths Food Bank for those in need. The sustainable food garden will enhance our community with fresh, organically grown produce that promotes healthy eating and exposes students to an agricultural education.
- Providing an outdoor space for numerous before and after-school activities that advances student achievement and cultural enrichment during non-school hours. Enrich cultural experience through gardening while making lasting connections with Israeli contemporaries.
- Allow students the opportunity to explore nature and reach a better understanding of science by integrating in-class lessons with outdoor hands-on activities.

This sustainable space aims to provide student with a holistic learning experience while also improving physical health, agricultural production/promotion and quality of education by allowing students to use applied concepts out of the classroom.
