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Reflection on Research Paper Revision

The piece I chose for this revision assignment was a paper from ENGL 335. In this paper, I compared two stories: *The Metamorphosis* by Franz Kafka to "The Babylon Lottery" by Borges by tying them together with a theme that appears in both texts: exploitation of the lower class in capitalist society. I also made connections from the texts to present day United States using that theme, and relating it to the COVID pandemic. I wanted to revise it because it is a topic that is still very important to me, and it is one of the few papers I have written on the subject.

I wrote this essay when we had just moved online due to COVID, so I wanted to revisit that section of my paper, and strengthen the points that I had made. Looking back, there is more to be said on that, and the section felt a bit rushed. I wanted to expand, and add more connections from the stories to the real world to show why the points, and themes of these texts are so relevant, and still apply to society despite their being published in the early 1900s. I also wanted to expand on Friedrich Engels in the introduction to make it more relevant to the essay since I opened it with a quote from him.
