How Does Putting the Lipstick in the Refrigerator Help?

When it comes to extending the life of lipsticks, a lower temperature is often preferable. This is since chemical reactions occur more rapidly at higher temperatures. (As a general rule, the rate of any reaction doubles for every 50°F rise in temperature.) Lipsticks are susceptible to oxidation reactions that can render certain oils rancid, and storing them in the refrigerator can help halt this process. The only issue that could arise is noticing beads of "sweat" on the stick. These are oil drops rising to the surface of the stick from the wax matrix. This is referred to as "syneresis." If excessive sweating happens, the lipstick will not distribute evenly across your lips.

How Long do Lipsticks Last When Put in the Refrigerator?

Colder temperatures delay the process by inactivating the breakdown enzymes. When these enzymes are inactive, the shelf life of lipstick is extended.

Although lipstick freezes changes in consistency or texture slightly, depending on the stability of the wax, oil, and pigment mixture, the wax component of lipstick can become harder at freezing temperatures. This results in a more concentrated texture and a sensation of tugging on your lips as you apply it.

Fortunately, manufacturers often undertake temperature-variability studies during production to identify and correct potential adverse responses. As a result, the product should be stable in cold weather conditions, including zero degrees Fahrenheit.

Does freezing lipstick kill bacteria?

Yes, freezing your lipstick will kill bacteria. Place your lipstick in the freezer overnight, and remember to remove it in the morning. However, remember that some germs can withstand the cold, which means that lipstick may not be entirely germ-free.

Additionally, you can use an alcohol spray for this.

Vodka would also work. However, drinking alcohol may not be as successful as rubbing alcohol at eliminating germs, so it is better to stick to that. Finally, you can remove the lipstick's top layer by rubbing or scraping it off.

There are numerous methods for storing new lipsticks. If you intend to store them in a cupboard or drawer, maintain a steady temperature in the region.
