Where did the Name Osoyoos come from?

The name Osoyoos derives from the Okanagan word "s̀wìw̓s" (pronounced "soo-yoos"), which means "narrowing of the waterways" in the indigenous Syilx'tsn language. The prefix "O-" is not indigenous and was added by settler-promoters to unify the word with other O-names in the Okanagan Country

What is the City Known for?

Osoyoos, is associated with heat. Osoyoos, Canada's lone desert, has the highest average annual temperature, the lowest average annual precipitation, and the warmest lake!

Additionally, Osoyoos is visually stunning, from the steep hills and surrounding mountain ranges to the rolling wineries and sandy beaches.

What is the Weather in Each Season?

Summers in Osoyoos are warm and sunny, winters are cold and snowy, and the climate is partially cloudy all year. The temperature normally ranges between 24°F to 89°F throughout the year and is rarely under 10°F or beyond 97°F.

If you wish to visit the city of wonders during the summer, the best time to visit is from late June to late August.

From June 10 to September 11, the hot season lasts three months, with an average temperature above 78°F. July is the hottest month, with an overall average of 87°F and a low of 59°F.

If you like to wear your cozy sweater and relax near the fireplace, the cold season, which lasts three months from November to February, has an average temperature of less than 44°F. December is the city's coldest month with the city's temperature going as low as 25°F.

What is the Name of the Lake in Osoyoos and What are Activities on the Lake?

Osoyoos Lake, dubbed the "warmest lake in Canada," covers fourteen miles and is a popular destination for summer enjoyment and winter sports.
