

Tributes rebel fears reprisal

MAN who fears for his life after tearing down tributes to stabbed burglar Henry Vincent is trying to recruit former soldiers to protect him.

Iain Gordon said police have warned him that Vincent's family are after him for trashing a shrine to the career crook

Writing on Facebook, where he also revealed plans to disrupt Vincent's funeral, he said: "I need ex military to contact me re honing their skills. Doing good & getting paid!"

Vincent's relatives returned to the scene vesterday to mark what would have been his 38th birthday.

The crook was stabbed to death by OAP Richard Osborn-Brooks, 78, after he broke into his house in Hither Green, south-east London. But the road has become a battle

ground between Vincent's traveller family and locals angry at the tributes they are leaving to him.

For the first time, police stepped in, asking the 20-strong group of women and hooded youths to make their shrine further down the road.

A 20-minute argument followed, during which the group accused police of "racism", before they eventually agreed

One woman said: "Why are

you being racist? Why are you people picking on us?"
A middle-aged woman, who identified herself as Vincent's aunt, said: "We won't be back, but I will say that it's a thing

against gypsies." After laying their tributes, which included pictures of Vincent, the travellers left in a fleet of cars.
