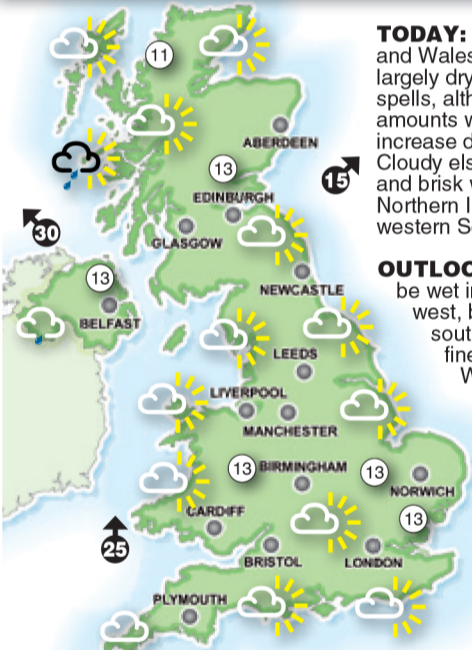

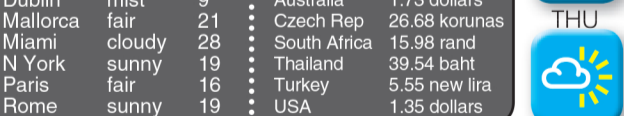
OUTLOOK: Tomorrow will be wet in the north and west, but fine in the south-east. Largely fine and warm on Wednesday with plenty of spring sunshine.

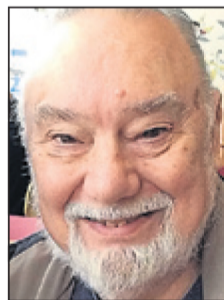
Tributes rebel fears reprisal

A MAN who fears for his life after tearing down tributes to stabbed burglar Henry Vincent is trying to recruit former soldiers to protect him.

Iain Gordon said police have warned him that Vincent's family are after him for trashing a shrine to the career crook.

Writing on Facebook, where he also revealed plans to disrupt Vincent's funeral, he said: "I need ex military to contact me re honing their skills. Doing good & getting paid!"

For the first time, police stepped in, asking the 20-strong group of women and hooded youths to make their shrine further down the road.

A 20-minute argument followed, during which the group accused police of "racism", before they eventually agreed to move.

One woman said: "Why are you being racist? Why are you people picking on us?" A middle-aged woman, who identified herself as Vincent's aunt, said: "We won't be back, but I will say that it's a thing against gypsies."

Vincent's relatives returned to the scene yesterday to mark what would have been his 38th birthday.

After laying their tributes, which included pictures of Vincent, the travellers left in a fleet of cars.

The crook was stabbed to death by OAP Richard Osborn-Brooks, 78, after he broke into his house in Hither Green, south-east London. But the road has become a battle

FERTILITY LINK TO PAIN PILLS

WOMEN who take painkillers during pregnancy could be harming the fertility of their unborn child, research has found. Paracetamol and ibuprofen were found to reduce the number of cells which later become eggs or sperm in babies, according to journal Environmental Health Perspectives. University of Edinburgh researcher Dr Rod Mitchell advised women to "take the lowest possible dose for the shortest time possible".

NHS TOURISTS OWE MILLIONS

HEALTH tourists owe £139million to the NHS. Hospitals in England have got back just £86m out of £225m billed to overseas patients since April 2013, a report says. Labour MP Meg Hillier blasted: "It's simply not fair the taxpayer should foot the bill for treatment of overseas visitors who are not entitled to free hospital care." A Government spokesman said a new law means overseas patients are now charged upfront for non-urgent treatment.
