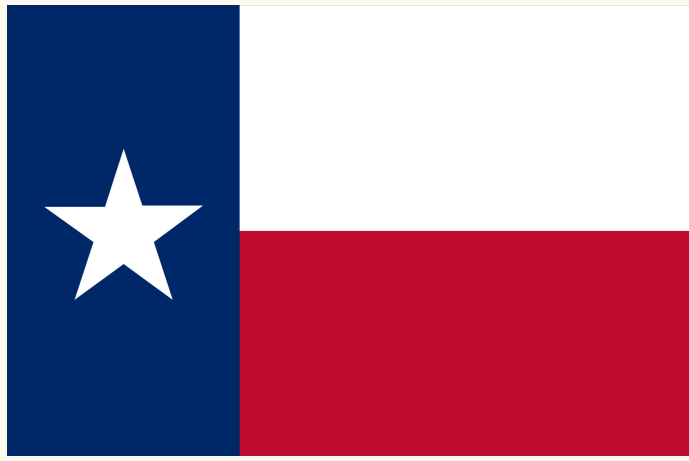


My Life- Bryce Crego
