

85% houses in Chimbel have no toilets!

AAP panel, residents submit memo to N Goa collector

Panaji: A delegation of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Goa along with residents of Chimbel on Monday submitted a memorandum to North Goa collector Nila Mohanan highlighting the need of toilet facilities in some of the villages.

In the petition the AAP stated that for over the entire Indiranagar and Gaulembhat in Chimbel village (not taking into account the residential buildings), 85 per cent of the houses were without toilets and appropriate sanitation. On further enquiry, they ascertained that most of these families pay house tax, water bills and electricity bills in their own names.

The AAP has also submitted a list of 141 households without toilets in the two wards of Chimbel

village. At present the locals use a lone Sulabh toilet that is open only from 8 to 10:30 in the morning and in the evening from 4 to 6.

There is one toilet for gents, one for ladies for both wards of Indiranagar and Gaulembhat. This makes it very difficult for women especially

pregnant women and children to use the toilets in the night.

Other times, the women and children defecate in the open and it creates

a whole new health and sanitation issue.

The AAP women's front exhaustively surveyed some of the villagers of Santa Cruz, Sant Andre, Cumbharjua, Ponda, Sattari taluka and even parts of Mapusa and Panaji constituencies and found that most of the areas were without toilets. However, the report of the Chimbel villager was alarming, it said.

AAP has urged the district collector to take the necessary steps to ensure that the toilets are constructed within an express time frame of four months so that the villagers don't suffer any longer.

The AAP delegation comprised general secretary Pradeep Padgaonkar, women's front convener Uma Volvoikar, co-convener (North) Iona Yvette Fernandes and others.

50% of beds in GMC are occupied by alcoholic patients: Dr Kakodkar

Curchorem: Dr Jagdish Kakodkar said alcoholism is a huge problem and nearly 50% of the beds available in Goa Medical College and Hospital, Bambolim are occupied by patients who need medical attention due to consumption of alcohol.

He was speaking at an awareness programme organised by Humanitarian Relief Society Goa at Shanthi Sadan, Bansai-Curchorem on Saturday. Speaking further Dr Kakodkar said anybody who starts drinking alcohol is actually taking a step towards committing suicide.

He said parents have to be role models for children and asked parents to guide children to make the right friends and keep them away from the negative influence of lifestyles led by celebrities who are the models for the present generation.

Dr Kakodkar also said parents should be aware and watchful of the environment in and around schools and colleges. Alcohol companies are leaving no stone unturned to increase their sale among the teenagers, he added.

Fr Walter Miranda of Guardian Angel High Secondary School shared his thoughts on the subject and asked the gathering to establish strong family ties as a shield against alcoholism. Later Br Ateeq Ur Rehman, NLP expert and life coach said that prohibition is not the way ahead but developing God consciousness and accountability will help change the attitude towards alcohol. Earlier, Asif Hussain introduced Humanitarian Relief Society Goa. He stated that HRS Goa has kept itself busy with social service in the field of medical awareness and aids, educational counseling and scholarships for the needy students.

Ruling MLAs to get Rs 25 crore each as developmental funds

Panaji: Chief Minister Manohar Parrikar on Tuesday assured MLAs of the ruling dispensation to provide developmental fund of Rs 25 lakh each to undertake various developmental works in their respective constituencies.

The Chief Minister held a meeting with the members of the coalition partners at Porvorim and discussed developmental works in their respective Assembly segments. The meeting was attended by members of BJP, M G Party, Goa Forward Party and independent legislators.

It is learnt that the Chief Minister assured them to release Rs 15 lakh by December this year and another Rs 10 lakh before the end of the current financial year.

The meeting was convened following complaints by MLAs that the contractors were not undertaking PWD works due to delay in clearing their bills. The Chief Minister told them the reasons such as election code of conduct and GST for the delay in clearing the bills and requested them to submit their list of priority works to the PWD.

A similar meeting will also be held with the opposition MLAs, it was informed. The Chief Minister also informed that a joint meeting of officials of commercial tax department, chartered accountants, engineers and other related officers to sort out GST confusion would be held in the city on November 29.

Panaji: The Government of Maharashtra has invested Rs 20 lakh in the International Film Festival of India (IFFI) Film Bazaar for marketing six Marathi films, said Milind Lele, advisor to the Cultural Minister of Maharashtra.

Keeping in mind the wide audience for Marathi films, Lele emphasised on the need for national and international level marketing of Marathi films. "A lot of initiatives are being taken by the Maharashtra government to promote Marathi cinema and market it in an international forum. With this objective in mind, Cultural Minister of Maharashtra Vinod Tawde ensured that three Marathi films were sent to Cannes Film Festival and 10 films for IFFI, Goa," Lele told GT.

According to Lele, since last three years, the meticulous planning behind promoting and marketing Marathi films at world level is bearing its fruit. "From this initiative, the producers and directors of the film are getting adequate exposure and competing at par with

their international contemporaries," said Lele. Speaking of the marketing strategy and the budget spent on marketing Marathi films, Lele said, "The Marathi producers often need to be supported financially and also to get their recognition from the State government. Whenever it comes to an esteemed forum for films, the two main segments

that take centre stage are Bollywood and Bengali art films. However, we have noticed that some of the Marathi films are equally potent in their content, making and production, which can easily get recognition in Indian Cinema," Lele said.

Informing that Rs 20 lakh is invested by the Maharashtra government in Film Bazaar, Goa for marketing of the Marathi films, Lele also said that the B2B marketing is the USP of Film Bazaar. "Only the films certified by Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC) are allowed to buy and sell in Film Bazaar. There are certain limitations that have to be considered. In film Bazaar, rights of the film are sold. Rights like dubbing, audio rights and others are sold here," said Lele.
