Aurora Borealis, Nature's Spellbinding Wonder

Join the chase and capture sights of the elusive, yet stunning Northern Lights.

s a renowned phenomenon that's on every avid traveller's bucket list, the Aurora Borealis or more commonly known as the Northern Lights, is a natural wonder that has captivated millions around the world. There are several times in a year that are best for viewing the Northern Lights, these include the months between January and March. These months are relatively more popular compared to any other months in the year to see the lights. The long winter nights offer a higher chance of witnessing the unforgettable sights of nature's greatest wonder. The various hues of colours dancing across the sky, beneath the

snow-clad land is stunningly scenic.

Besides shorter days, these nights are also accompanied by frigid temperatures. However, if you are unable to withstand the chilly weather, you may opt to visit the Arctic region between September and October. The pristine lakes, which remain ice-free for most this period, are known to reflect the brilliant colours of the Northern Lights. An interesting fact about the Aurora Borealis is that the naked eye is unable to detect the full spectrum of colours displayed across the sky. It's the main reason why most only see green hues. However, photographic images are known to capture the broad range of

colours filling the Arctic sky.

While waiting for the nightfall, local guides will usually offer visitors with a tour of the region and its highlights. In addition to being acquainted to the native wildlife, you will also gain a deeper understand and respect of the diverse flora and fauna of the Arctic. For instance, the Pallas National Park will provide nature-lovers with a chance to meet some of the animals, such as huskies and reindeers that inhabit the area. You may also spend your time engaging in other activities like cooking, where you will be taught to prepare local cuisines on an open fire. If you would like to


take it up a notch, consider spending a night in the Aurora Dome. Shielded from the ice-cold temperatures, these iglooshaped structures provide a view of the Northern Lights in the comfort of your cosy space. Each dome is insulated and is equipped with a fireplace to keep you warm and toasty in the dead of winter. The accommodation also comes with one transparent wall that allows you to observe the surroundings and provide an unhindered view of the Arctic sky. Besides falling asleep under the serene, starry night sky and cooking like a local, you may wish to partake in the exciting winter activities available, including skiing, hiking, snowmobiling and joining a Husky Safari.

DAY 1 SINGAPORE > OSLO

Meals on Board

Assemble at Singapore Changi Airport and depart for **Oslo**, the capital of Norway

DAY 2 OSLO

Meals on Board

Upon arrival, spend the day at your leisure. If this is your first time to visiting Norway, consider joining an optional sightseeing tour to explore the city and learn more about the Norwegian history, culture and lifestyle.

DAY 3 OSLO → LONGYEARBYEN

Breakfast, Dinner

Board a domestic flight to **Longyearbyen**, the administrative centre of Svalbard Island, as well as the **Northernmost settlement** with a population of around 2000 and the realm of Polar Bear. Admire the gorgeous scenery featuring mountains and crystalblue fjords. Meet up with a local city guide to get an overview of Longyearbyen and the surrounding areas. You will be guided through the major local sights and history of Longyearbyen. The tour will bring you close to the coal mines, some research areas, village, church, and the global seed vault

which is the world's largest seed storage. There will be stops along the way to take photographs. Visit **Svalbard Museum** and entrance fee is included, which will feature an exhibition on Svalbard's history and present natural places in Arctic Norway.

DAY 4 LONGYEARBYEN

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner Join a boat trip to **Pyramiden** which is a Russian settlement located in Billefjorden. It has been named after the nearby mountain top. Sail slowly past the mighty Nordenskiöldbreen (Nordenskiöld Glacier) on our way to Pyramiden. Upon arrival, follow our English speaking guide to visit the abandoned mining city Pyramiden. On our trip into town, the guide will unlock the City Cultural Center to us. It housed both cinema, music school and a gymnasium. Although the city is characterized by decay, one can still sense how beautiful it once was. Please note the total duration (boat trip, guided tour, lunch on board) is around 9 hours and subject to weather condition. Note: The duration of boat trip to Pyramiden and Nordenskiöldbreen is minimum 7 hours and subject to weather condition. All passengers may be required to stay on boat all the time for sightseeing, depended on the ice condition outside Pyramiden.

DAY 5 LONGYEARBYEN

Breakfast, Dinner

ATV safari to Adventdalen - drive Can Am Outlander ATVs out into the beautiful tundra colours which are so typical of Svalbard in the summer. The Arctic summer is short and intense with a rich migratory bird population, and it is not unusual to see our tougher permanent residents the Svalbard reindeer and Arctic foxes. With daylight around the clock, it doesn't matter if you choose the morning or the afternoon; it will be light until October. Our trip runs out into **Adventdalen**, a tundra environment loaded with Arctic history and wildlife, we stick to the roads so that we might better preserve this fragile ecosystem. We stop at several points; such as the old airport to Longyearbyen, one of the mines, and up on one of the local mountain tops to catch the view over the valley and the fjord. We also stop at the Basecamp trapper's station and dog yard, where we talk about the hunting and trapping culture in the North, and we serve coffee and biscuits. The ATV safari is a great way to learn just a fraction of what makes Svalbard such a fantastic place to live, and we guarantee you will leave feeling enriched from the experience.

DAY 1 SINGAPORE > REYKJAVIK

Meals on Board

Assemble at Singapore Changi Airport and depart for **Reykjavik**, the capital of Iceland.

DAY 2 REYKJAVIK

Meals on Board

Your exploration of Iceland begins with a **Reykjavík city tour**, where you will first get to visit **Perlan**, a fantastic dome-shaped glass building supported by six massive water tanks, with an impressive water feature that runs from the basement into the atrium. Next, visit the beautiful **Höfði House** and the **Hallgrímskirkja** church, whose unique,

magnificent structure dominates the skyline, making it visible from every part of the city.

DAY 3 REYKJAVÍK > GRÁBRÓK CRATER > AKUREYRI

Breakfast, Dinner

Kick off the day with an adventure to **Grábrók Crater**, located on the outskirts of Reykjavík. The largest of three craters in a short volcanic fissure, take on a short climb up to the top of the crater to be rewarded with amazing views of Borgarfjordur and the perfect dome-shaped volcanic cones in the surrounding field. After which, head onwards to **Akureyri** for a guided sightseeing tour of the small, laidback port city. Enjoy the rest of

the evening free at leisure and take the time to admire the picture-perfect scenery.

DAY 4 AKUREYRI > GOÐAFOSS WATERFALL > LAKE MÝVATN > HVERAFJALL > MÝVATN NATURE BATHS > NORTH ICELAND

EEarly birds may wish to opt for an optional whale-watching excursion in the morning to try and get a rare glimpse of these gentle giants of the sea. Thereafter, visit one of the most magnificent waterfalls in all of Iceland, Goðafoss. Feast your eyes upon the magical sight of agua blue water torrents gushing over falls shaped like a horseshoe, a vision that becomes only more stunning in the evening when the sun sets. The geographical wonder of Lake Mývatn is the next stop, a site brimming with Earth's natural wonders - from lava fields and rock formations to sulphur springs and dark caves. As darkness falls, have a restful night at a countryside resort in the north of Iceland.

DAY 5 NORTH ICELAND > DETTIFOSS WATERFALL > ÁSBYRGI CANYON > HÖFN

Breakfast, Dinner

Often referred as 'The Beast' as compared to 'The Beauty' of Goðafoss, **Dettifoss waterfall** in **Vatnajökull National Park** is your first destination of the day. Prepare to be blown away by the sheer size and wild power of this majestic falls, coloured a misty grey due to the rich sediments of the **Vatnajökull glacier**. Capture stunning photos at the vast landscape of **Ásbyrgi canyon** before we journey on to east Iceland for a night's stay.

DAY 6 HÖFN > JÖKULSÁRLÓN > SOUTH ICELAND

Breakfast, Dinner

Make your way to **Jökulsárlón**, Iceland's famous glacial lagoon filled with floating icebergs. Venture into the deepest lake of Iceland on a thrilling boat excursion that brings you to sail among the huge icebergs that break off from the **Breiðamerkurjökull glacier**. Get a taste of the 1000-year-old ice, and if Lady Luck is on your side, you may catch sight of seals zipping through the icy waters. Movie buffs may get a kick out of this tour as this beautiful lake has starred in Hollywood blockbusters like A View to Kill, Die Another Day, Tomb Raider and Batman Begins.

DAY 7 SOUTH ICELAND > GOLDEN CIRCLE TOUR > REYKJAVÍK

Breakfast, Dinner

Enjoy a scenic drive with a view of Iceland's natural beauty on Route 1 along Iceland's South Coast. Witness the magic of nature in the form of **Reynisfjara Beach's** famous basalt columns that stacks up into the shape of a pyramid as you stroll along the black sandy shores. Then, continue on to view the impressive Skógafoss and Seljalandsfoss, two of Iceland's most famous waterfalls found in the south region. Make a pit stop at the Eyjafjallajökull Visitor Centre before you embark on Iceland's classic sightseeing tour - the Golden Circle - to discover some of the most spectacular scenery and historic sites in Iceland. The first stop will be at Iceland's most popular waterfall, the Gullfoss, and if you're lucky, you may even be able to catch sight of a rainbow arching over the tumbling waters flowing into the deep gorge. Continue on to the nearby

geothermal area, a site bubbling with activity and an abundance of hot springs. Here, you will be able to view the lively **Strokkur** geyser which spouts water 30 metres into the air every 15 minutes. Next, photo stop at **Thingvellir National Park**, a place of historical significance and geological interest. You can also view the **Althing**, an open-air assembly in the park where Iceland's oldest existing parliament first assembled in 930 AD. We will return back to **Reykjavík** where you will stay for the night.

DAY 8 REYKJAVÍK > BLUE LAGOON > HELSINKI

Breakfast

After breakfast, we go for a soak in the **Blue Lagoon** geothermal spa, famous for its healing mineral-rich waters surrounded by jet-black basalt lava. Free at leisure till transfer to Helsinki. You will enjoy one night stay in Helsinki, capital of Finland.

*Note: Helsinki one night stay may be replaced by another city, subjected to flight schedule and transit point.

DAY 9 HELSINKI > SINGAPORE

Breakfast, Meals on Board

Enjoy the rest of the day free at leisure to do some shopping or sightseeing in **Helsinki** till it is time to transfer to the airport for your flight home.

DAY 10 ARRIVAL IN SINGAPORE



An Unforgettable Journey to the Baltics

Be inspired by the multitude of experiences when you visit the Baltic countries.

rom sights encapsulating the past, to traditions and practices as diverse as the countries themselves, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania captivate travellers from all walks of life.



Lithuania

Lithuania has always charmed visitors with its heterogenous offerings. For instance, Vilnius, land of baroque beauty, is the largest capital of Lithuania. It is home to people of different races, creeds and cultures such as Germans, Slavs and Jews. The city also houses buildings that encompass neoclassical architectural styles.

The Vilnius Cathedral Basilica, situated on the edge of the bustling Cathedral Square, is the main venue where many local events such as fairs, parades and concerts take place. The structure of the building is similar to that of a square Romanesque building. It includes a massive tower and is surrounded by more than 40 artworks dating as far back as the 16th-19th centuries. Rumours has it that if you step on the 'magic tile', which is located between the Vilnius Cathedral and the Bell Tower, close your eyes and turn around three times, your wishes will come true.

St. Anne's Church will also fascinate you with its unique exterior. Gothic masterpieces that were built in the end of the fourteenth century virtually remained unchanged until today. Countless arches, graceful towers and artworks captivate visitors from all the world. Located just opposite of St. Anne's Church is the Bernardine Church and Monastery. It is much more spacious and possesses a different architectural style, with strong Renaissance and Baroque features. Art lovers will be able to admire the sixteenth century wall paintings and the Lithuanian crucifix sculpture from the fifteenth century. While here, do visit the Gothic bell tower, standing 17 metres tall with spiral staircase that provides a panoramic view of the city.

Latvia

Besides being known for its unspoiled countryside, Latvia is also famed for its medieval architecture and places steeped in historical significance. The capital city of

Riga is famed for its age-old buildings and attractions that reflect the ancient history of Latvia.

The Dome Cathedral in Riga dates as far back as 1211, when the foundation stone was laid. It is the oldest and grandest church in Latvia, and to this day it remains actively utilised for hosting major concerts, various musical performances and official services. One of the main highlights of the cathedral is the enormous organ, which is believed to be around since the 16th century or earlier.

Situated in Riga, the Swedish Gate is one of the must-visit places in Riga Old Town. Erected in 1698, it is the only remaining gate from the medieval city walls. It was used by the Swedes to enter Riga when the city was a part of Sweden. Today, the gate or wall is a part of the residential buildings in the area. Retaining its ancient facade, the distinct structure stands conspicuously among its relatively modern counterparts.



Estonia

Comprised of urban attractions and natural highlights, Estonia is renowned for its eclectic mix of attractions. Its dramatic sceneries contrast with many of its age-old buildings and structures. One place that is notable for its diversity is Tallinn, the capital city of Estonia.

From its vibrant nightlife to its rich cultural scene, the popular destination caters to travellers from every walk of life. Its medieval Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is comprised of medieval city walls and towers that have remained intact to this day. Within these fortified walls, you will find old buildings with red tile roofs, hidden courtyards and winding cobblestone streets.

DAY 2 MOSCOW

Meals on Board, Dinner

Once you arrive, enjoy some free time to explore this exciting city at leisure. As dusk falls, prepare yourself for a night of entertainment with a performance by the world-famous **Moscow State Circus**.

DAY 3 MOSCOW

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Kick off the day with an exhilarating adventure to the **Moscow Kremlin**, an old fortified complex in the heart of **Moscow** that has witnessed generations of Russia's rulers and remains as the official residence of the President of the Russian Federation to this day. Home to some of the most beautiful Russian Orthodox monuments, make your way to the **Cathedral Square** to find some of the most magnificent churches that have each played their part in

history. Gaze in wonder at the architectural masterpieces of the Assumption Cathedral, the Annunciation Cathedral and the Archangel's Cathedral, as well as the Tsar Bell and the Tsar Cannon that are displayed on the grounds of the Kremlin. Thereafter, go for a sightseeing tour of the unique Russian city, which will bring you to view the Red Square, St. Basil's Cathedral, the GUM Department Store and Lenin's Tomb. Last but not least, embark on a Moscow Metro tour of one of the world's most elaborate transport systems and discover for yourself why Moscow's Metro is also known as the most beautiful railway as well.

DAY 4 MOSCOW > SERGIEV POSAD > MOSCOW

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Take a side trip out of Moscow today and head to the pilgrim town of **Sergiev Posad**, founded by the country's most revered monk, **St. Sergius of Radonezh**, himself. Pay a visit to the **Trinity Sergius Lavra**, the most important landmark of this town as well as one of the most important monasteries of the **Russian Orthodox Church**. Admire the famous icon and other impressive works

by Andrei Rublev within the Cathedral, or take a look at the collections of traditional tapestries, gold and silver tableware, and furniture and embroidery at the Sergiev Posad State History and Art Museum-Preserve.

DAY 5 MOSCOW > ST. PETERSBURG

Russia is a country that has impressed

and attractions steeped in history and culture.
From the bustling port city of St. Petersburg to
the iconic Moscow Kremlin and the Kremlin
Cathedrals, Russia has proved to be a country
full of amazing sights and wonders just
waiting to be discovered.

St. Petersburg

As the second largest city in Russia, St. Petersburg offers travellers with numerous things to see and do. The city is one of the most prominent places to discover the artistic, cultural, and historical scene of Russia.

One major tourist attraction in St. Petersburg is the Peterhof Palace. Situated in the town Peterhof, the site is comprised of a lavish palace and a series of parks, gardens and fountains. In addition to the city centre, the Peterhof Palace was also recognised as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Also known as "the Russian Versailles", the complex was built upon Peter the Great's request and desire to construct an imperial palace. The palace and park was further expanded by Empress Elizabeth, who extended the stunning Grand Cascade, which comprises of 64 different fountains

accompanied with 200 bronze statues. While here, visitors will also be greeted by the imposing yet magnificent Grand Palace. Completed in 1721, the structure's interior is as grand and breathtaking as its exterior. Behind its Baroque facade, its expansive rooms are opulently fashioned with walls adorned with ornate decor and paintings by Pietro Antonio.


Another place of interest would be the State Hermitage Museum, one of the largest and oldest museum in the world. As a fine example of Baroque architecture, the building is located on the bank of the Neva River. Although the structure was recognised as a museum in 1917, the former museum was an imperial residence for 150 years. The whole complex includes five buildings, with the regal Winter Palace housing the bulk of the art collection. The State Hermitage Museum captivates visitors with its 2.7 million exhibits and numerous art and artifacts from all over the world.

Moscow

The capital of Russia is a vibrant, cosmopolitan city that thrills travellers with its iconic structures reflecting the rich history of the nation. The Red Square is a notable tourist destination in Moscow that

boasts most of the significant landmarks in Russia. As the heart of Moscow, it is home to attractions such as the striking St. Basil's Cathedral and Moscow's Kremlin.

Built to celebrate the capture of the Tatar stronghold of Kazan in 1552, the St. Basil's Cathedral encompasses domes that are embellished with contrasting colours and conspicuous designs. Although it may seem that the overall structure has been put together rather haphazardly, its quirky architecture is steeped in symbolism. Even though there are many theories as to what the cathedral represents, one theory suggests that the domes represent the number of assaults Kazan had faced in the past. The building has also made it on the UNESCO World Heritage List. Another place of interest is Moscow's Kremlin, a medieval fortress dating as far back as the early 14th century. The compact and self-contained citadel, which comprises of numerous palaces, armories and cathedrals. Serving as the seat of the Russian government, Moscow's Kremlin has always played an integral part in Russia's history. Even today, the Kremlin continues to establish itself as a notable site, as it continues to host gatherings between government officials and other world leaders

Start your day with a city tour upon your arrival to **Yekaterinburg**, the fourth largest city in Russia. Founded in 1723, the city

rapidly grew as the centre of the Urals mining region and a major pillar of the metallurgy industry. When the Siberian Route was built in 1761 to deliver Chinese goods to Europe through Russia, Yekaterinburg became a major hub in the transit of minerals from Siberia to European Russia, taking on its nickname of the "Window to Asia. Nowadays, Yekaterinburg presents itself as a major cultural and industrial centre of the Ural Region.

DAY 6 YEKATERINBURG > TRANS SIBERIAN

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Make your way to Ganina Yama today. Situated 15 km north of Yekaterinburg, this place is a memorial of the Romanov's assassination at the hands of the Bolsheviks. A memorial has been built at Ganina Yama, at the place of the burial, which consists of seven chapels, one for each member of the imperial family. Visit a monument erected on the border between Europe and Asia. While here, you will cross the border between Europe and Asia in Yekaterinburg. Join a panoramic tour of Yekaterinburg, where you will discover the historical city centre, which features several buildings typical of 19th century Russian architecture. You will also see the Monument to the City



the Chapel of St. Catherine. Next, make your way to the former Mining Office, the first stone building in Yekaterinburg and the State Conservatory; the oldest Opera House in Russia. Afterwards, you will head towards the Square of 1905 and October Square where the buildings of the City Parliament and Regional Government are located. Next, make your way to the Nevsky Cathedral in Yekaterinburg, before heading to the Church on the Blood, a site commemorating the location of the Tsar's murder. You will then transfer to the railway station and depart for Novosibirsk. Spend the night on board.

DAY 7 TRANS SIBERIAN > NOVOSIBIRSK

Start your day in Novosibirsk, the third largest city in Russia. Spend the day at your leisure.

NOVOSIBIRSK > TRANS SIBERIAN

Breakfast, Lunch

Today you will discover the **Metro Bridge** and the Novosibirsk Dam. While here, you will also see the expanse Siberian Sea. Next, head to the Railway Museum, which features several locomotives and carriages from different periods, and learn about the historical evolution of transportation on the Trans-Siberian Railway. You will then head to **Akademgorodok**, the University City and research centre of Siberia. Second World War. Admire the exterior views of the **Ascension Cathedral** and **Alexander Nevsky Cathedral**, the first stone building in **Novosibirsk**. Make a final stop at the **chapel of St. Nicholas** the Miracle Maker, before transferring to the railway station. Depart for Krasnoyarsk and spend the night on board.

Arrive at Irkutsk and explore this main city in eastern Siberia. Founded in 1651, the region was known for its gold mining and trade. These days, the region is Siberia's main commercial and cultural centre. Depart for Lake Baikal, a fresh water reserve that is accompanied with amazing sights of dramatic landscapes. Join a panoramic tour of **Listvvanka**. one of the oldest settlements on Lake Baikal. Visit places such as the orthodox wooden church of Saint-Nicolas and the small market, where the local babushkas sell smoked fish from the lake and some locally produced handicrafts. While here, you will also get to see the **Tolstoy Cape** and the Lighthouse.
