Background

In June 2016, the law in Pennsylvania required all the children under two years of age to ride in a rear facing car seats. These new Pa car seat laws allowed a better experience to the driver and a healthier car ride in case of an accident. This law was to keep children safe at all times.

The law also confirmed that children that did not outgrow the height and weight limits were eligible to this law. The safety standard set was more about the size and physical weight of the child than it was about the age. Hence, adding a layer of safety for the child passenger.

The major reason why Pa Car Seat laws needed attention was that the rules were vague. The vagueness allowed many people to strap children in front facing seats, and some even without car seats. The law ensures a healthier and safer practice whether one gets the gist of it or not. Some parents found it appropriate to buckle their young children in booster seats. Booster seats are good, just not for babies under age 2!

Another reason why this law felt necessary was the lack of knowledge. Young age parents prefer front facing seats instead of rear ones. While these add a layer of safety, they prove equally dangerous in a

fatal car crash. The car seat law in Pa specifically state that children under two years use rear facing seats for maximum protection.

The law did not stop at baby safety seats only. It states that child passengers up until the age of 18 cannot sit in a car without properly installed child passenger restrain system. Hopefully, by the time they become adults, they will have the habit of wearing seatbelts so that they remain safe all along. Front passenger and the driver have a legal requirement to wear seatbelts at all costs.

Along with the Pennsylvania car seat law, came a list of recommendations. These are great for first time parents, oblivious parents, or even people that do not understand the importance of car seats and seat belts for any reason. The following are a few recommendations pointed out for children passenger safety under 4 years.

- **The right car seat**

Choosing the right car seat is slightly tricky. There is more than just buckling and leaving your child passenger in the safety seat. However, the best and least you could do is choose one that fits your child perfectly. Moreover, the seat should take up the weight of your child as well. Ensure that it fits all of your cars where you plan to use this seat. If you have to change the seat a while later because of your child's growth, then do it! There should be proper restraints including shoulder belts. There is nothing more important than safety especially for children under the age of 4 years.

- **Acquaint yourself with the seat**

One of the best things you can do is acquaint yourself with the seat of your choice. No matter how many times you have used one before, imagine it is the first. Carefully read the manufacturers' instructions. Find out about the latch system and how tight they need. Check the size of the seat and the height and weight of your child as well. Apart from the height or weight, a trained technician's touch on them is best.

- **Keep your child for a long time**

To ensure safety for as long as possible, do not hurry to get your child out of the seat. You may need to do some extra work and make extra effort, but life is worth it! Ensure that your child reaches the maximum age, and height and weight where they do not require the seat anymore. The best kind to use here are the rear facing car seat for your child.

For Pa Car Seat Laws, it goes up to 2 years or 35 pounds. However, the recommendation exceeds that. It depends on the car seat manufacturers. Even after the car seat, do not let your child passenger sit shotgun before the age of 13. That is the only law children need to follow.

Is it that important?

Pa Car seat laws along with many other are very strict. They are there to ensure that you get the most of safety for your children.

Some babies find car rides comfortable enough to sleep. The perfect car seat adds to these details.

Types of car seats

1. Infant seats

Infant seats are exactly what they say. These seats have limited capacity and works for infant only. They allow about 30 pounds only or even less. These seats come in different options. However, they generally face the rear only, which is the safest and more effective.

2. Convertible seats

If you want to make your seat last longer, the convertible ones are for you. These face the rear and even the front. As per the Pa Car Set laws, you can use this as rear facing car seats for two years and then convert it. However, the best is to keep children facing the rear for as long as possible.

3. Belt positioning seats

These seats are for toddlers and over. They usually go beyond 40 pounds and four years of age. They have a different buckling system to help keep toddlers safe. They are both, forward facing car seats and rear facing designs.

4. Booster Seats

These boost the car space to their height and weight. There are buckles and belts for safety too. These usually work for children up until 12 or 13. Booster seat laws, Pa are as important to follow, so keep an eye out.

Booster seats need your attention as well. There are a separate section of laws and recommendations. Booster seats are usually the same size that makes the selection easy.
