black taxi driver in London and was devoted to his career.

Growing up, I watched him study for the Knowledge Exam every evening at the kitchen table, memorising transport routes, landmarks and popular destinations, too.

'Don't touch anything!' Dad would say, pointing at his maps hung up on the walls.

I spent my childhood tip-toeing around them, but I was always secretly impressed.

Although I was intrigued, I pursued a different career.

Working in primary schools instead, I managed their breakfast, summer and after

school clubs.

But I always found myself struggling for money, especially when raising my daughter Le Sian, then seven.

'I'm tight on money. Can I borrow some?' I asked Dad. 'Why don't you do the

Knowledge?' he proposed. You can be your own boss, work around Le Sian and vou'll always have money in your pocket.'

It was like a lightbulb moment for me, but I knew how hard it would be.

So, I put it offuntil 2009, when I kickstarted the process.

Dad took me to the carriage office to apply and bought me a moped to learn the routes.

There's no other way!' he insisted despite my protests.

But with Dad falling terminally ill in 2010 and passing away, the grief was overwhelming and I delayed my exam until 2015.

Passing it first time – I knew Dad would be proud.

But during my weekly revision classes. I had noticed that there were barely any women there.

After signing up to FREENOW in 2019, a taxiordering app, I started balancing my work around my two daughters, Le Sian, now 24, and Je-Nae, now 10.

It brought me so much ease and I wanted to encourage other women to get involveď, too.

Why don't you help run some of the ladies' classes, Lisa?' my old mentor asked me. And here was my chance!

In 2020, I ran women-only Zoom classes to help them prepare for the Knowledge. sharing my best revision tips.

It was so rewarding helping one woman pass who had five children, of which two had additional needs.

Now, in between my taxi trips, I teach classes in-person once a month and seeing all the women's hard work pay off makes my all my work worth it.

But without Dad's encouragement, I would never have taken the wheel and seized control of my own life.


And keeping his legacy alive makes it all the sweeter.
