"You cannot play it until I die." PRINCE 'One of One' audio recording to be auctioned off by the owner 42 years later.

Lot includes Certificate of Authenticity as a one of one NFT collectible.

September 07, 2022 FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE Prince Rogers Nelson was only 21 years of age on March 21, 1980. Approximately four years after he graduated high school and just five months after releasing the self-titled *Prince* album containing the lead single *I Wanna Be Your Lover*, Prince's first major hit single in the United States. March 1980 was just two months before he started recording the *Dirty Mind* album and years before achieving global fame.

This rare and only remaining audio recording containing the previously unreleased performance will be auctioned by Prince's audio engineer, **Steve May**, who had a special and unique role to record the artist under Prince's direct instructions.During this tour Prince gifted the rare cassette tape to May with the condition that it could not be sold until the artists' death. May has held onto the tape since 1980. Now in his 70s he wants to share this rare collectible with Prince's fans. This rare auction will support charities supporting music education for kids in marginalized communities along with a portion going back to the Prince Estate.

The cassette tape is one of the last pieces of music memorabilia available from the artist. Prince Rogers Nelson would have been 65 this coming year making his 75 years of his life celebration 10 years from now -and the cassette- undeniably more valuable (a second recording of a similar tape was burned in an unfortunate fire). A timeless purchase. Prince continues to inspire generations with his unparalleled musical excellence and fearlessly independent spirit for artists, *"Tell me a musician who's got rich off digital sales. Apple's doing pretty good though, right?"* Prince was ahead of his time.

Steve May and the team handling the auction have decided to utilize Web3 technology with a smart contract/NFT for verification of the collectible to protect the original recording of the tape and to ensure it stays authentic. The LIVE 1980 BUNDLE is an exclusive auction for the physical tape *handpicked by Prince* of his set at the Cleveland Public Arena on March 21, 1980. The auction includes a custom handcrafted gift box (designed by Mason Webb and assembled by Tim Barrett) securely encasing the cassette, and includes an NFT certifying the item's authenticity. The auction will take place during this year's <u>Miami Art Basel</u>.



BackStory of Auction

The LIVE 1980 BUNDLE is a physical/digital auction and one of the first rare recordings to be digitally authenticated. The NFT validates the cassette's authenticity as a 1-of-1 audio recording, making the tape and the NFT rare items of historical and cultural importance. Future verification, transaction history and trading can be done seamlessly between collectors. The certificate of authenticity NFT is minted on the <u>CELO</u> blockchain which builds on carbon offsets and *keeps gas fees reduced to negligible amounts.*

The audio recording containing the previously unreleased performance will be auctioned by Prince's audio engineer, **Steve May**, who recorded the artist, **EQ Exchange**, the first full-stack artist lifecycle management platform leveraging Web3 technology, **Blank Check Agency**, the Web3 management firm, and **B2P** marketing (Browned 2 Perfection). The 1979 -1980 Story:

Prince felt this is the best sounding show of the tour, which is why he gifted the recording to Steve May. *"It was as if I was sitting and listening to him play live even after 40 years,"* said Steve May of the cassette's audio quality which was recorded with over \$120,000 worth of equipment at the time. Steve May worked as a sound engineer for Cavallo Ruffalo Management (CRM) out of Los Angeles in 1979 where he traveled to Minnesota, Prince's hometown, to work with Prince on his then upcoming tour.

Prince made a special request to have Steve May record each set in order to critique his bands. Steve May set up a stereo system in his dressing room and would bring the tapes for the band to listen to and go over nightly. On the last tour date, Prince Nelson gifted Steve May with the recording of their show at Cleveland Public Arena with the following instructions to abide by:

"Thanks, you did a great job on this tour. I'm giving you this tape from our best performance, but there is a catch - You cannot play it until I die."
