
## Long Term Issues

Declawing can make a cat less likely to use the litter box and/or more likely to bite. Declawing also can cause lasting physical problems for your cat such as permanent pain in the paw, tissue death, lameness, and back pain...

## Solutions to scratching

To avoid your cat ruining furniture try these tips:

- -Keep their claws trimmed
- -Provide scratching posts and boards
- -Attach a special tape to furniture to deter your cat from unwanted scratching.
