Q1: Name two reasons why home-based ball stitching a better alternative for women stitchers in Sialkot than working in a stitching center.

Below are the two reasons why home-based ball stitching is a better alternative for women

1: Conservative Mindsets.

The males of the villages believe that women should stay at home and that they have no business outside so home-based ball stitching is a perfect way to earn income and without having to create marital problems in the family. Most of the males of the family don't actually allow the women of their households to go out and work so it is easier to convince the males of the family on home based ball stitching.

2: convenient.

It is convenient for the women to work and also balance their home life and get done with the day to day chores of the household without having to leave. They can focus on their children and families this way.

Q2: what are three challenges in recruiting school inspectors in Sindh due to the current system of hiring?

For starters, there was only one recruitment criterion: anyone with a B.A. and a B. Ed. (a professional degree) may apply for the inspector position. There appears to have been no purposeful effort to connect the applicant's skills and experience with the functions required by the post.

Second, there was no established procedure for hiring staff. This was a result of the government's recruitment procedures in the education department, and in government service in general, where no direct recruitment for specialized professional employment was performed.

Lastly, This scenario was complicated by the fact that the inspector's position was comparable to that of a high school teacher, meaning that these teachers and the inspectors were on the same grade and pay bracket. As a result, anyone from a huge pool of high school teachers may apply for the inspector's position, which had relatively broad selection requirements based only on academic qualifications and seniority.

Question -3

Why is it common for hypertension to be misdiagnosed?

The most common factor for hypertension to be misdiagnosed is measurement errors.

A false positive (FP, hereafter) error occurs when measurements of patients' blood pressures are above certain cutoff points while their true blood pressures are under those thresholds. A false negative (FN, hereafter) error happens when observations of patients' blood pressures are below cutoff points but their true blood pressure levels are above those thresholds. Subjects falsely classified as hypertensive suffer psychologically, economically by paying and taking unnecessary medication, and experience physically the side effects of various medicines etc. Hypertensive subjects falsely classified as normotensive will not receive treatments and thus run a much higher risk of heart attack, stroke, and death etc.¹

What two moral assessments within the just war tradition show that the use of drones in Pakistan by the US should be illegal?

According to the article published in journal The Political Quarterly by the author MAHMOOD AHMAD the two moral assessments are described as follows:

In an attempt to assess whether the use of drones in tribal regions of Pakistan has been in compliance with the law of conflict management, the just war tradition offers two separate moral assessments of uses of lethal force: jus ad bellum (the right to war), and jus in bello (conduct of war).²
