On June the 22nd, a 5.9 magnitude earthquake struck eastern Afghanistan at around 1:24 a.m. local time. The epicenter was approximately 28.5 miles southwest of Khost, near the Pakistani border, and was 6.2 miles deep. The impact was limited but widespread. The 5.9 magnitude earthquake killed 1,000 people and injured at least 1,500. The settlements of Gayan, Nika, Barmal, and Zirok in Paktika province were all severely damaged.

The country's resources were already tight before the earthquake, but now local hospitals are overflowing with injured survivors. Health officials are also concerned about the development of cholera among earthquake survivors who do not have access to safe drinking water. Afghanistan's health system has been struggling immensely under the weight of this tragedy.

The recent natural calamity is a severe setback for Afghan families already enduring chronic poverty, misery, and suffering before the disaster. It will now leave them with

lifelong injuries and no place to live. Worse yet, tens of thousands of homes that remain standing have sustained serious damage and are in danger of collapse.

Before this natural disaster, Afghanistan was already in the grip of a humanitarian crisis. Now people are now suffering from much greater hardships. Drought, economic collapse, and soaring global food costs have brought millions of Afghans to the verge of hunger.
