The GIA diamond grading scale assigns a letter grade from D (colorless) to Z (light yellow or brown):

<u>The Gemological Institute of America (GIA)</u> has a clarity scale that ranges from Flawless (FL) to Included (I1, I2, I3).

The scale is as follows:

- 1. Flawless (FL)
- 2. Internally flawless (IF)
- 3. Very, very slightly included (VVS1 and VVS2)
- 4. Very slightly included (VS1 and VS2)
- 5. Slightly included (SI1 and SI2)
- 6. Included (I1, I2, and I3)

The Carats Weight Influences Price More Than Appearance

Carat weight is the unit of measurement used to describe a diamond's size.

While larger diamonds may be more visually striking, keep in mind that carat weight significantly influences diamond prices.

Therefore it's essential to balance carat size with the other 4Cs to ensure you're getting the best value for your diamond purchase!

Which C is the Most Important?

Although each of the 4Cs contributes to a diamond's overall quality and value, the cut is considered the most important C.

If the diamond is expertly cut, the facets will work together in perfect harmony with light, enhancing the stone's brilliance and making it truly sparkle to reveal the true beauty of the diamond!
