# Vanderbilt Reichert Planetarium Ready for Summer Visitors Newest Show, Laser Beyoncé, Premieres June 30

**CENTERPORT, N.Y.** (June 1, 2018) – Summer is a great time to enjoy spectacular, laser-light musical entertainment shows at the Charles and Helen Reichert Planetarium at the Suffolk County Vanderbilt Museum.

The Planetarium is bringing back audience laser-show favorites like *Led Zeppelin* and *Pink Floyd: Dark Side of the Moon*, and will premiere its newest show, *Laser Beyoncé*, on Saturday, June 30, at 7:00 p.m.

"Our educational and entertainment programs attract a diverse audience to one of the finest planetariums in the country," said Lance Reinheimer, Director of the Vanderbilt Museum. "The Planetarium is part of the 43-acre Estate and Museum of the late William K. Vanderbilt II. In the past year, the Vanderbilt was a destination for more than 100,000 visitors, including guests from more than 30 countries."

Dave Bush, technical and production coordinator for the Planetarium, said the programs at the Reichert Planetarium are intended for a variety of age groups.

"We present award-winning, world-renowned, full-dome productions, as well as live presentations with an astronomy educator that show off the amazing capabilities of our domed theater's cutting-edge technology. The Reichert Planetarium boasts the highest level of laser programming available."

Live presentations include *Long Island Skies* on Fridays at 8:00 p.m. and *Night Sky, Live!* on Saturday at 8:00 p.m.

The Planetarium also presents shows that feature jaw-dropping journeys to the outer reaches of the Solar System. The 60-foot domed theater features a Konica-Minolta star projector, full-dome video and surround-sound for an exciting, immersive audience experience.

#### **Museum Admission**

General museum admission is \$8 for adults, \$7 for students with ID and seniors (62 and older), and \$5 for children 12 and under. General admission includes estate-grounds access to the Marine Museum (closed temporarily for renovation), Memorial Wing natural-history and ethnographic-artifact galleries, Nursery Wing, Habitat Room, Egyptian mummy and Stoll Wing animal-habitat dioramas. For a mansion tour, add \$6 per ticket. (A video tour of the mansion is available on request.)

#### **Mansion Tours**

Guided tours of the Vanderbilt Mansion -- listed on the National Register of Historic Places -- are available Tuesday, Saturday and Sunday at 1:00, 2:00, 3:00 and 4:00.

#### **Planetarium Admission**

During the day, visitors to the Planetarium pay general museum admission (\$7 for adults, \$6 for students with IDs and seniors 62 and older, and \$3 for children 12 and under), plus \$6 each for a Planetarium show. For evening Planetarium shows on Friday and Saturday, visitors pay \$10 for adults, \$9 for students with IDs and seniors 62 and older, and \$8 for children 12 and under.
