For whole blood donation, the blood donation process takes about 10 minutes. For platelet donation, the process takes a total of two hours.

Any healthy individual who is at least 16 and at least 110 pounds with high iron levels is welcome to donate whole blood. Anyone who is at least 17 years old and at least 110 pounds is welcome to donate platelets.
